Those who are unborn, infirm and terminally ill have no such advantage. They have no "utility," and worse, they have no voice" (US Bishops, Living the Gospel of Life, 1998, n. 3-4).

This week, I have an update on Father Norman G. Koller. According to a parishioner, I discovered that he was originally our priest when we were founded as part of a mission under the order of The Fathers of the Precious Blood. Father Koller was associated with the order. However, 5 months after he arrived, it was decided that O.L.V. wouldn't be a part of the mission. Father Koller was recalled by the order and Father Garrity arrived. During the brief time he was here, it seems that Father Koller celebrated Daily Mass, as well as performed a baptism, and is listed in the Diocesan Archive as our first priest. It also seems



that while he was here, he found the property that we currently have, as when Father Garrity arrived, the property was already being looked into as a possible location for the Parish. I was excited to find this part of our history, as well as recognize a priest who served our community, if only briefly. After some digging, I found more information on Father Koller. He was born in New York in 1912; he was ordained in 1938 in Ohio. He served as priest in Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Ohio, Missouri, and Iowa. It seems that for most of his time, he served as a hospital chaplain. He died in 1965 at the age of 53. His brother J. Gordon Koller and nephew Gerold Koller were also priests. His obituary is online, and from it, I was able to find this photo of him.

Puerto Rico

Hurricane Relief Effort

<u>From</u>: Father Luis Rodriguez, VF, Pastor of Corpus Christi Parish in Chambersburg

It is with a certain degree of relief that I was told last night that my family in Puerto Rico (brothers, aunt, uncles, cousins etc) on both sides, father and mother, are physically unhurt and their homes faired well. However, a humanitarian crisis is looming for the region.

Because the electricity is off, what they are saying will be for months, most have no access to their monies in order to buy food and water. Their supplies are dwindling, some unprepared are getting desperate.

Virginia Pereira, former diocesan coordinator of our Hispanic Apostolate, and I will be traveling to the island with a small relief team to distribute what we collect here, in a 40-foot tractor trailer relief container and go directly to the towns at the parishes we are from. I am from Humacao and she from Cidra with another stop in Yauco. Humacao sustained a direct hit as it is just 15 minutes drive north from Yabucoa where the Hurricance eye came in through.

The 40 foot container will depart October 5 by boat from Philadelphia to San Juan. It will arrive October 12. The team will arrive October 11th and return the 16th. In San Juan we have secured a distribution place to break down the donations to be carted to the parishes. The tractor trailers here and in Puerto Rico are being donated.

(Relief items should be taken to **Corpus Christi Church up to October 4 at 10:00 AM** at the parish social hall located at 279 North Second Street, Chambersburg. No other items will be

taken after that date and time. We are looking for volunteers who have trucks and/or vans to help us move all goods to Saint Francis of Assisi, Harrisburg by midday October 4 to be loaded into the 40 foot container.)

All money donations must be made out to Saint Francis of Assisi Church, with the memo - Puerto Rico hurricane relief.
