DECLARATIONS UPDATE:

The Declarations Committee and the Board of Directors have reviewed the changes suggested by our Attorney Robert Todd, who is recommending updates to bring us in line with current state statutes and laws. Changes include protecting us from corporations buying up properties for sale here in OR III. Following the Board's final review, a letter was sent to Attorney Todd to consider a few minor changes made by the Board.

Once finalized, two informal informational meetings will be held to share the proposed changes. Timing of these meetings will depend on how soon we hear back from Attorney Todd. It is expected these meetings will be in January. Formal voting would then take place at the February Association meeting. Attorney Todd has been invited to attend that meeting to answer questions from homeowners.

As chairman, I would like to thank my Committee members for their dedication to getting these updates reviewed, prepared and to the Board for their approval. Members are Shirley Finefrock, Ann Parks, Pam Champeau and Rebecca Enck. Thank you, each and every one for your willingness to server.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE:
