ANNOUNCEMENTS

SUMMER MASS SCHEDULE: The only weekday Mass celebrated during the summer months will be on Thursdays at 10am. Sunday Sung Mass will be held at 9:30am. **The Church office is closed on Mondays and Tuesdays**.

MASS FOR INDEPENDENCE DAY: Join us on the 4th of July for a Low Mass at 10:00 a.m. in the Lady Chapel.

CHURCH RESTORATION NEWS: Work will soon begin to restore and repoint the north side brownstone wall of the Chapel. The project will include the removal of all the stone mortar joints and repointing the facade with waterproof ribbon joints. The brownstone coping of the Chapel will be restored, repaired and repointed. The north side window perimeter will be caulked and sealed. This restoration work will also include the south side brick foundation of the Rectory. The bricks will be restored, reset and repointed. The goals of these projects are to strengthen the structures, stop water infiltration, and to prepare for the plastering and painting of our Church interior. All this work will be completed by A. Pennacchi & Sons, Inc., Hamilton, NJ. The Pennacchi stone masons worked on our bell tower and the church restoration project during December 2018 through February 2019. The funding of this restoration work is supported by our Capital Fund portion of our Investment Portfolio. We are sincerely grateful to our benefactors whose bequests and contributions have built our Capital Projects Fund.

SAVE THE DATE: The 15th Annual Blessing of the Fire Trucks will take place on Saturday, **September 11, 2022, at 5pm.** As usual, the Mass will be preceded by a time to learn about fire prevention and some family fun.
