


WHEN THINGS GO WRONG

I doubt that many people will call 2020 a year to remember with fondness, given all the calamities we've experienced this year. From COVID 19 to riots, fires, hurricanes, election turmoil and tragic deaths, we have experienced a significant amount of anguish and anxiety. Some may question where God is in all of this trouble, but the answer is simple: He is right here with us, as He promised to be. He has heard our prayers and kept the disasters from overwhelming us (see Isaiah 43:1-3a). He has used our hardships to turn hearts back to Him (see Psalm 66:10 -12). He has disciplined us in love when we strayed from him (see Hebrews 12:-11) and when we thought we knew best (see Proverbs 3:5-6). God leads us to repentance and forgives us with Jesus' shed blood (1John 1:7-9). "Belonging during a Pandemic" A Note from Jarryn

With the Jr. High Rally having been almost three weeks ago from the Jr. High Rally and the National Youth Gathering prep peeking its head over the horizon. There is always the guestion of what is the importance of these events, even more with the situation of this pandemic. When it came to planning the Jr. High Rally we had a choice this year; to go ahead or to cancel. We on the planning committee made the choice to go ahead. Our choice was based simply on trusting God. We discussed it and it became clear that these youth need to hear about how their identity is found in Christ. So many kids have been isolated and alone during this time that they are losing a sense of belonging. We made plans to keep everyone as safe as we could but ultimately we had to trust God's plan. It is during these events where they get to be part of a bigger group, and it's in those groups where these youth they can grow. They challenge the youth to try and live more like Jesus, to not fall into the pitfalls the world has. More then that it gives them a foundation to turn to when they do make a bad decision. They can see that they are not alone, that they have support from others around them.

These communities can help the youth realized their gifts and talents. Through opportunities the youth are given to use the gifts God has given them. These opportunities are found in service projects, leading their small group in Bible study, or just talking with the other youth around them!

These events can help build them emotionally and physically. It gives them an opening into how other people outside of their family and inner friend circle live and the struggles they have. They may find they aren't the only ones that struggle with a certain issues.

It is also in these communities they get a chance to look at forgiveness. We are all sinful and we are bound to hurt each other outside and within the community of these places. However, within them we are reminded of God's grace, love and forgiveness, whether it is in the songs we sing or in Bible readings.

"For this reason, I, Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus on behalf of you Gentiles—assuming that you have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for you, how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I have written briefly" (Eph. 3:1–3).

There is that word: stewardship. It is a word that so many Christian people balk at. In fact, it isn't really a joke that when the word "stewardship" is mentioned in church, men guard their wallets and women clutch their purses. The Church has earned this response. Over the generations, the Church has allowed the word stewardship to become equated with the financial resources necessary to compensate staff and pay bills.

So, as we consider simple gifts, does it surprise you that Paul would willingly talk about stewardship with the people of Ephesus? Notice what He isn't talking about: money. What Paul is talking about is REAL stewardship, which deals with stewardship of God's grace. That is the Gospel of Jesus Christ!

The greatest gift that our Lord has given us to steward is the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Truthfully, it is the ONLY gift we are given to steward. How you are led by God to steward the resources entrusted to you by God are to be stewarded for the sake of the Gospel. How you use your stuff tells a great deal about what you think of the Gospel. If your stuff is used to help your family, friends, congregation and community to better understand the Gospel, you are a faithful steward. If it is about you and your comforts, or even their comforts, that isn't faithful stewardship.

This perspective is helpful. It also causes us some grief. None of us are always faithful in our stewardship for the sake of the Gospel. What Paul calls us to in these words is repentance. Today we ask the Lord to work in and through our stewardship so that the people around us will KNOW about our stewardship of the Gospel as individuals and as a congregation.

Prayer

Heavenly Father, as You entrusted the Gospel of Jesus Christ to Your servant Paul, so You have entrusted it to me. I admit that I have not always been faithful in my stewardship of the Gospel. I have been more worried about my comfort and my legacy than the extension of the Gospel. Lead me to see and use the simple gifts You have entrusted to me for the sake of the Gospel of Jesus Christ! Amen.
