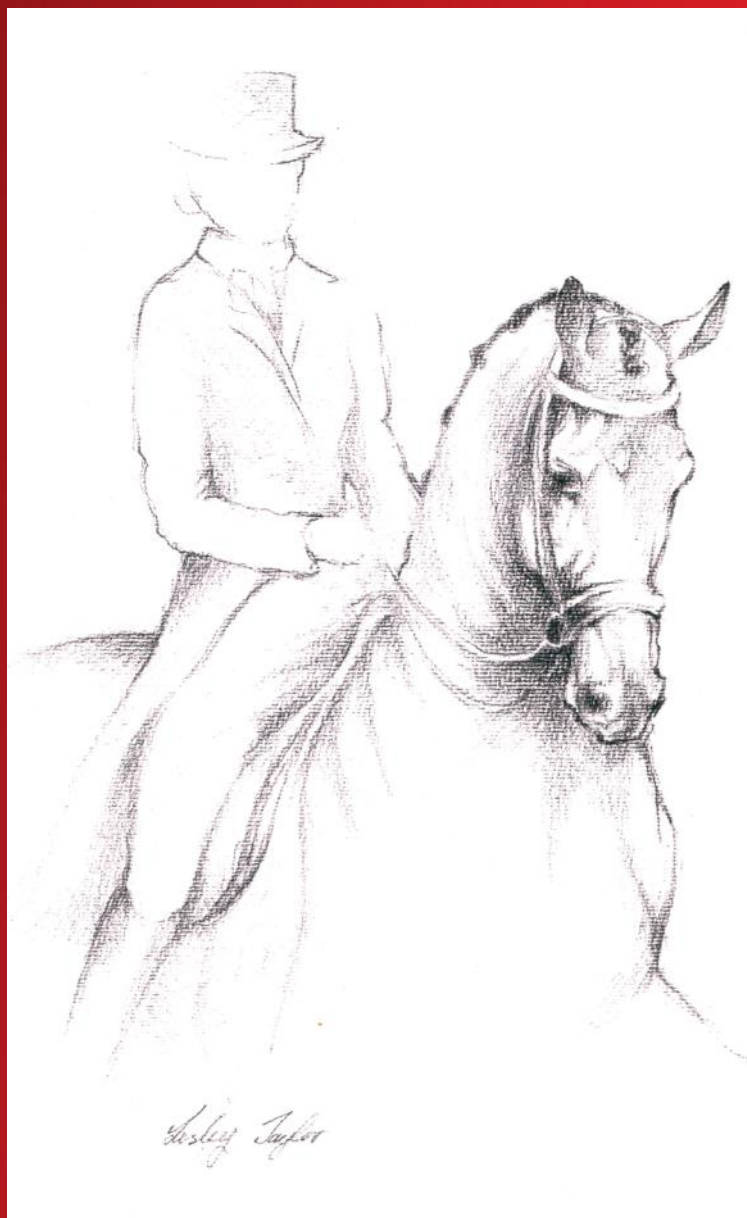

Swabbing

Swabbing is the informal name for Medication Control Procedure (MCP) for EA or Equine Anti Doping Medication Control Procedure (EADMCP) for FEI. I thought it might be useful to give the uninitiated an overview of the rationale for swabbing and what is involved in the procedure.

Horse welfare and ensuring a fair competition are the two main reasons swabbing is undertaken. Horses may be swabbed at any EA or FEI dressage event. Selection is at random from all competitors or place-getters or targeted in the case of horse / s the Ground Jury consider warrant testing. Swabbing make be done at any time during an event, although it usually takes place immediately after the completion of a test or prize-giving ceremony.

A Swabbing Steward will notify the rider of their horse's selection. Refusal to submit the horse to testing may incur disqualification from the competition. From this point onwards the rider is known as the "Person Responsible" and must stay with the horse and actively witness the entire swabbing process. If the rider is not able to remain with the horse or if they are under 18 there is provision for an alternate Person Responsible to be nominated. The Swabbing Steward will accompany the horse and Person Responsible at all times after notification.

The horse may be untacked, hosed down and given a drink before proceeding to the swabbing box. The horse is identified by the vet. The swabbing kit is opened in front of the Person Responsible and they are asked to check the integrity of its contents. The Swabbing Steward or vet then performs the urine collection. A horse can be held for a maximum period of 30 minutes for this. Six blood samples are then collected by the vet. Throughout these procedures it is imperative that the Person Responsible watches carefully, both as the samples are being collected and when they are being sealed and packaged for dispatch to the laboratory.

This is just a brief overview of swabbing but I hope it gives an idea of what goes on. If you would like to know more, you can find all the information you need at:

September 2018

Two upcoming events are planned for the Dressage Judges calendar. These events are open to anyone interested who wants to come along. Riders from all disciplines are very welcome!

Saturday 3rd November

Susie Hovenaars will present the A / B judges seminar (a workshop for judges of any other level). Registration is at 8:30 am for a 9:00 am start with theory at the ESA Office, Cameron St Mt Barker. The practical session starts at 1:00pm at Tilling Hill, Berry's Road, Echunga. This event is free of charge to all judges and coaches, \$10 for others. We are fortunate to have this opportunity with Susie who is an FEI 4* International Judge and Judge Educator and recently judged at WEG in Tyron, USA.

Friday 30th November:

How and why Dressage training improves every discipline, presented by Martin Plewa. This event will be held at McLaren Park Equestrian Centre, Foggos Road, McLaren Flat and opens at 5:00 pm for a 6:00 pm start (9:30 pm finish). Martin Plewa will discuss and demonstrate how and why dressage training can improve all disciplines, including use of poles and jumps. Martin is one of the most highly qualified dressage trainers to come to Australia. This evening will count as a workshop for all judges and for coach accreditation. Head And Neck Position In The Horse And In The Rider

In order to move, horses must be able to support, balance, and propel themselves. The forelimbs act as supporting struts and the hindlimbs as levers that can propel the horse forwards, sideways, or upwards. Balance comes from reflexes that respond to changes by stimulating or inhibiting specific muscles that maintain particular postures or movement patterns.

From birth, horses are so well-connected throughout their bodies that movements of the limbs create consistent movements in the head and neck that are independent of any muscle input; rather, the extensive connective tissue network throughout the body enables these changes in head and neck position. Hence, the transit time for information about movements to reach the brain from the body is minimised because it only has to travel between the neck and the brain.

In other words, horses are born with a well-connected body on a predominantly self-balancing, 4-legged support which they apparently learn to control by moving the head and neck. Therefore, *a person controlling the horse's head and / or neck controls the horse's body.*

Influence of the limbs on head and neck position

Mechanically, the limbs 'drive' the head and neck when the horse is in balance, comfortable in his body and emotionally stable and when the rider is not interfering too much. In that state, the forward swing of the **forelimb** causes head flexion, while the rearward swing causes head extension.

Hindlimb movements have more complex effects, as they are integrated with whole-body posture. When the hindlimbs 'engage' correctly and support the rider, the horse becomes 'light' and rises in front of the saddle as the vertebrae in the lower part of the neck take up a posture of *flexion*. This posture stretches the laminar (sheet-like) part of the nuchal ligament, which further supports the whole horse via its spinal connections. This posture is the most efficient and well-balanced way for a horse to move, both independently and with a rider.

This mechanical connectivity provides a direct means by which the rider's seat and weight can influence the relationship between the movements of the hindlimbs and the position of the head and neck. This dynamic may be felt by the rider when the horse 'comes between the leg and hand' or 'goes in front of the leg' - both expressions of this connectivity in action. In addition, there are specific relationships between lateral bending movements in the back and the postures of the head and neck which a skilled and balanced rider may use to optimise movement.

Influence of head and neck position on the limbs

These mechanical connections do not work in reverse. Even extreme movements of the head and neck (eg. rollkur) can be made without necessarily affecting body position and balance. (One exception is the forelimb extension that occurs in suckling foals when the foal's head and neck are held in a very extended position to reach the udder.)

Instead, the normal head and neck movements affect a range of *postural reflexes* in the back and limbs that the horse learns to use and adapt in order to sustain balance and enact various movement patterns. In this regard, the horse's head and neck may be likened to the rider of a bicycle.

Horses have direct voluntary control of their bodies down to the base of the neck. In comparison, humans have that level of fine control all the way to our toes. It is therefore much easier for a horse to learn to balance and move than it is for a human, partly because there is less interference from voluntary movements, but also because the horse's body is so strongly and extensively connected, and it is supported by four limbs instead of two.

As an example of these postural reflexes in action, head and neck posture directly affects the tone in the flexor and extensor muscles, and therefore limb movement, in the forelimbs and hindlimbs. Extension of the head causes reflex hindlimb extension and flexion of the neck causes reflex forelimb flexion; and flexion of the head or extension of the neck does the opposite. In other words, **forelimbs follow neck posture, and hindlimbs follow head posture.** These are postural reflexes - neurological connections - rather than mechanical connections. There are many more reflexes that help to maintain movement patterns and balance.

Influence of the rider

The rider can learn to initiate and focus specific reflexes (especially the kicking reflex) in horses $\frac{3}{4}$ but this is possible only when the rider has sufficient balance, 'feel', and emotional control to use their body as an instrument to engage with these mechanical connections, as well as years of practice in understanding how to manage their own body and the effects of their aids.

Anything that interferes with the mechanical relationship between the horse's limbs and the head and neck will interfere with balance and movement control. Such interference can stem from unbalanced or inappropriate movements or aids from the rider, as well as from the horse, such as stiffness or pain anywhere. Thus, teaching a horse to stretch into their neck while maintaining self-carriage is often a useful start to training or retraining, as inefficient use of the neck will cause difficulties in maintaining balance and hence soundness.

Anything that causes the horse pain or fear, and any lack of balance or difficulties with movement, will result in excess tension in the head and neck, and therefore will interfere with balance and movement. Thus, 'control the head / neck, control the horse' can work for good or ill, depending on the rider.

A steady and 'giving' hand is necessary to avoid restricting the horse's own control of their balance and movement. Of course, it is necessary to temporarily restrict the head and neck in order to control an unruly horse, but understand that it is likely to cause more problems in the long run. Such restriction necessarily interferes with the nuances of communication that are possible between the rider and a calm, well-balanced horse who trusts and respects their rider.

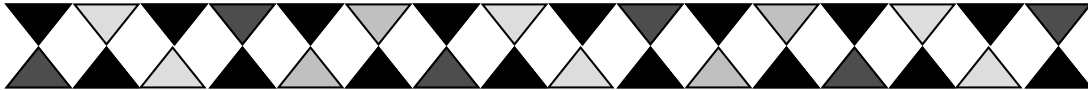

OCTOBER COMPETITION - 27th October

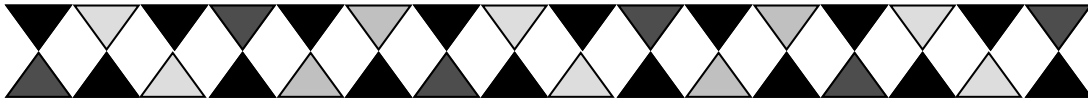

Again, Lynda was very popular and her experience with young horses really shone through.



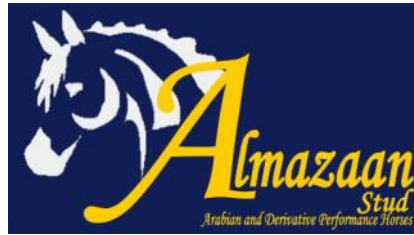
