Financial Overview

• Parking Authority

Total revenue year to date is higher than the previous year. However, vending and ATM Commissions are lower than normal. Volume at the bus terminal is high with the parking lot going into over flow on Wednesdays and Thursdays but the vending and ATM services are still lower than expected. Expenses are higher than the previous year. This is largely due to salary increases and snow removal expenses incurred during the first quarter.

• Park and Ride

Revenue and expenses are right on target as compared to previous year. Revenue Is expected to exceed the previous year as we go through the summer.

New Business

• <u>New Jersey Parking Alliance Co-op</u>: A request was made to join the New Jersey Parking Alliance Co-op. This purchasing co-op was created by the New Jersey Parking Alliance for all products that are commonly used by Parking Authorities including the IPS single space meters that the Authority is interested in purchasing to replace the old on street meters.

- <u>Contaminated Property at Bus Terminal-RFP for Bus Lane Paving</u>: The property of the bus terminal is a part of a NJ Natural Gas contaminated land clean up project. NJNG is attempting to eliminate the contamination through a process that is not proving to be as successful as they had hoped. It may be necessary for them to tear down the existing bus terminal in order to access the contaminated area. This will be decided later in the year. However, it was asked if capital repairs should still be done such as repaving the bus lane if this type of demolition is going to take place. It was decided to continue going forward with improvements in partnership with the DOT.
- <u>NJT Ticket App</u>: Pam Piner informed the Board that NJT announced that they would be releasing a phone app in late 2015 that would allow riders to purchase their bus tickets using their cell phones. This could possibly have a major impact on bus tickets commissions that the Authority earns at the Park and Ride. Chairman, Mike Sutton suggested that the Authority consider accepting credit cards at the terminal for bus tickets. Pam Piner will research best merchant accounts to use.

Unfinished Business

- <u>Parking Study:</u> Pam Piner, Jay Lynch and Paul Shives had a brief meeting to discuss the direction of the Parking Study. Paul Shives the Township Administrator requested that the Authority provide a report regarding rate increases and future plans that can be presented to the governing body for their support. He recommended that the Authority request an increase that will sustain the next several years so that only one rate increase will be necessary..
- <u>2015 Budget</u> The 2015 Budget is still at the DLGS.
- <u>New Pay Stations</u>: The new pay stations have been perceived very well and credit card usage is being used more than expected. Because the use of credit cards requires the purchase of maximum amount of time, revenue has increased.
- <u>New Single Space Meters:</u> A discussion took place regarding the replacement of single space meters on the street. Pam Piner suggested phasing in the replacements starting with Allen Street, Court House Lane and the east end of Washington Street. Chairman Mike Sutton suggested that maybe all meters should be done at once then the process would only have to be done one time. Once the New Jersey Parking Alliance completes the RFP process for single space meters then the Authority can move forward.
- **TRMUA Inter-local Agreement:** The Board of Commissioners for the TRMUA approved the inter-local and the agreement was presented to the Parking Authority Board of Commissioners for approval.
