

It's that time again! We're gearing up for an excellent summer with WallaceKids. One of the highlights of the summer is our annual trip to Campbell University for CentriKid Camp.

This year's camp is June 20-24 and will cost \$298 per student. We will have fundraisers to help with the cost, plus you can pay a little at a time if you need to. Payment deadlines will be published soon.

We need a \$50 deposit to sign your child up and sign up is happening NOW!


