Pentecost Sunday Year A Acts of Apostles 2:1-11



"When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? # Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Pentecost Sunday Year A

Acts of Apostles 2:1-11

This Springtime of the year gives us many opportunities witness transformation right before our eyes. For example, when the bare brown dirt of the flower bed begins to be peppered with green shoots, and then grows a leafed canopy of plants, that completely covers the brown bed of dirt. Or I have kept a keen eye this spring on the different type of leaves on plants, and how God uses different methods to roll out new life. Some leaves, unfurl lengthwise like ferns, while some leaves unspool sideways like hostas, and some leaves just simply seem to split in two, like a pod opening, before a new shaft rises up and then repeats the process on the next tier! And on and on! But God our Creator, keeps rolling them out! (I can't say I've been as blessed to see any new growth come out on certain trees and bushes after last December's sub-zero windy freeze-I'm sad that I lost my fig tree to the freeze!) Yet, spring brings all kinds of life transformations, such as birds making nest-homes out of scraps of string and dried grass before eggs are laid and break open to reveal songs and movements of the new hatchlings! So, what a transformative make-over of life all around us!

Since we are talking about new-life transformations, how about the incredible transformation of the Apostles as the Holy Spirit enters them on Pentecost Day! Jesus had promised the apostles the return gift of Himself, through the Holy Spirit (John 14:16, 26)! And the apostles demonstrate the change that Jesus in their lives fully makes: What a difference! Recall that we heard after Jesus' death & resurrection, the apostles were still hiding *behind 'locked doors'* (John 20:19 & 19:26)/ Yet, on Pentecost Day, we hear about Peter leading the apostles *out of the 'house* they were all gathered together in awaiting the Coming Spirit' (Acts 2:1-3). All around the apostles, multiple 'dynamic' signs such as 'moving winds', 'hovering fires' 'never before heard new languages' manifest themselves. An overall sense of God's Blessing Presence covers everyone. Peter delivers such an animated testimony that Acts 2:41 tells us that about 3,000 people were welcomed into fellowship with Christ and His Church through baptism that same day! Again, what a transformation of hearts and a tremendous display of new life, that God births among His People on that day!

But before we put too much emphasis on sudden, overnight changes, it is wise to consider that though some conversions occur in a flash, many more of them occur after a longer incubation period. For example, even though the Spirit did descend upon the apostles all gathered in the upper room in that one exciting moment, Jesus had been preparing them for that transformation for a while already (at least 50 days)! Experience teaches us too, that while lightning flash changes might make the most dramatic stories, they may not be as durable and lasting as what more conventional, but boring, training periods create. Even though today's first reading tells about a spectacular change brought about by the holy shock and awe of the Spirit's raining down fire upon the apostles, Jesus had in fact been preparing the apostles for this transformation since even before his death. Specifically, at the Last Supper, Jesus had said, "Now I have told you this before it happens, so that when it happens you may believe..." (John 14:29) in addition to telling them, "I have told you this so that when their hour comes you may remember that I told you" (John 16:4). Then after His resurrection, Jesus continued some advance teaching with them, preparing them for their conversion ahead as Acts 1:3 says, "he appeared to them during forty days, speaking about the kingdom of God." Following that 40 day instruction period, Jesus called them to spend a further nine days in prayer (the first novena!) waiting in Jerusalem for the Spirit's coming (Acts 1:4). So, their spiritual transformation wasn't truly an overnight one. It had been in the works for quite a while before fully manifesting on Pentecost.

Similarly, we often dramatize Paul's conversion as a sudden 'shot in the dark' conversion, but he also went through quite a lengthy follow-up after that initially dramatic encounter with Christ. Paul does undergo a transformation from being the church's greatest persecutor to becoming its greatest spokesperson. It begins with a flashpoint experience on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:3-4). But, if we keep reading Paul's conversion story, we find out that Paul goes through a lengthy recovery period that becomes a 'training and instruction' period, too. He receives extensive formation before he takes up actual Christian ministry. For example, following his blindness, resulting from the dramatic vision of Christ on the road, Acts 9:9 says that "For three days Paul was unable to see, and he neither ate nor drank." He was still sorting out what all his enlightening experience meant. Acts 9:19 says that "He stayed some days with the disciples in Damascus." Then Acts 9:22 tells us that "Saul grew all the stronger and confounded [the] Jews who lived in Damascus..." And to further fill in the gap of time following Paul's Damascus Road Encounter until his full-time engagement on the missionary circuit, he describes what sounds like a 'retreat period' in his letter to the Galatians, 1:17, where he says, "rather, I went into Arabia (a while) and then returned to Damascus." I imagine this 'Arabian' period for Paul was like a time of prayer reflection and formative concentration for him before he took up widespread public evangelization for Christ. But, certainly it indicates that Paul's conversion experience was much more involved and lengthy than simply one 'moment's transformation'. Paul's change of life, like the apostles', was the culmination of many preceding moments of grace that built up to new life in Christ.
