Holly Lynn Talaski, 20, of Harbor Beach went to be with her Lord Jesus Christ on Saturday, Nov. 2, 2002, at University of Michigan Medical Center in Ann Arbor following a year long illness. She was a former member of the Happy Gals 4-H Club for 10 years, The Indian Trails Riding Club, the Blue Water Thumb Youth for Christ and the New Covenant Singers. Holly graduated with honors with the class of 2000 from the Harbor Beach Community Schools where she was a cheerleader for three years and she was a member of the National Honor Society.
