

Pattern for the Crumb Tulip Block

Materials:

Background fabric (for a single block):

- (1) 2" X 2" squares
- (1) 2" X 3 ½" rectangles
- (2) 4" X 4" squares
- (3) 3 ½" X 3 ½" squares

Leaf Crumb Fabric (made in the workshop):


• (1) 4" X 4" square

Flower Color Crumb Fabric (made in the workshop):

- (1) 4" X 4" square
- (1) 3 ½" X 3 ½" square
- (1) 2" X 2" square


Directions:

- Place one 4" background square on top of the 4" leaf square and the other 4" background square on top of the 4" flower square. Right Sides Together.
- 2. Draw a diagonal line through the center on the 4" squares.
- Sew a scant ¼" seam on both sides of the drawn line.
- 4. Cut the fabric on the center line, and press to the light side.
- Putting the diagonal line on your ruler along the diagonal seam, trim all four of the blocks to 3 ½" square.









- Sew the 2" X 2" background square to the 2" X 2" flower square.
- 7. Sew the assembly above to the 2" X 3 ½" rectangle of background fabric.



- 8. Arrange into rows as shown.
 - a. Row 1.



- i. The block with the 2" flower square. The colored part to the bottom right
- ii. One of the half square flower blocks with the background fabric to the upper right
- iii. One of the 3 ½" background blocks
- b. Row 2.




- i. One of the half square flower fabric blocks with the background half to the lower left.
- ii. The 3 ½" crumb flower block
- iii. One of the half square leaf blocks with the background to the upper left

c. Row 3.



- i. One of the 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " background blocks
- ii. One of the half square leaf blocks with the background fabric to the upper left.
- iii. One of the 3 $\ensuremath{\ensuremath{\mathcal{Y}}}\xspace''$ background blocks
- 9. Sew the blocks into rows. **Do Not Press**.





This will result in a 9" finished block. (9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished).



This is a perfect size for a pot holder. It could also be arranged into a table runner, or a wall hanging.
