

## 10 FUN ACTIVITIES FOR YOUR CHI ALPHA MU CLUB

1. Play the 24 Game ([www.24game.com](http://www.24game.com)) – This game has been around for awhile and there are many versions to fit different levels.
2. Make flash cards for younger students. These can be math facts or vocabulary terms.
3. Provide tutoring or homework help for younger students.
4. Create a giant game board and questions that could be used for state assessment review.
5. Research careers that use math and make posters.
6. Find examples of “bad math” and make a hallway display titled *Why You Need Math*.
7. Pair students up to make short videos or slideshows of math topics.
8. Create packaging for an item and calculate volume, surface area, etc.
9. Research MC Escher and create a tessellation.
10. Conduct a Math Fair – like a science fair but with math topics. Students can research and display topics such as statistics, geometry, trigonometry, algebra.
