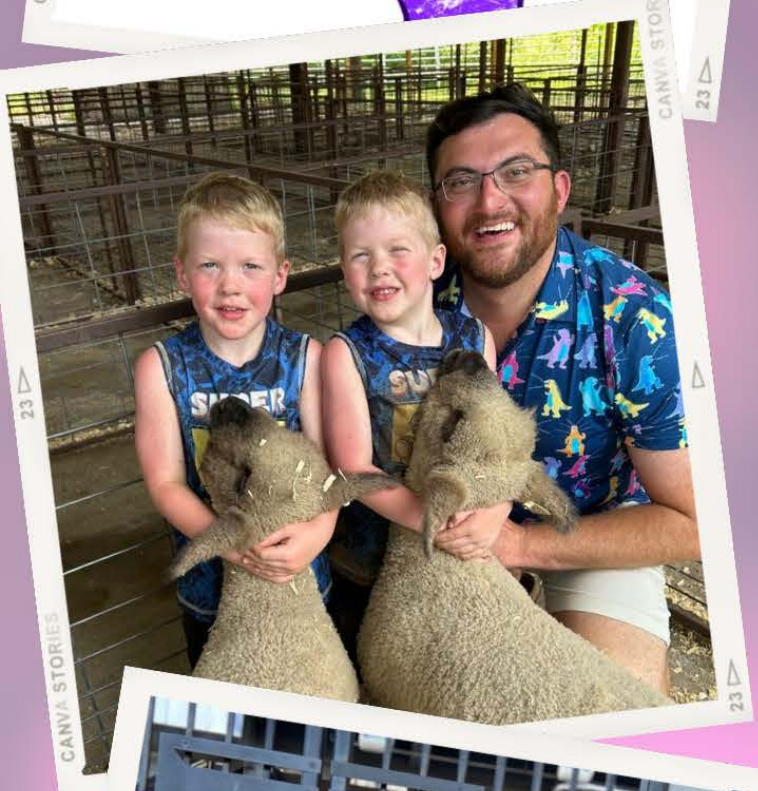

General Breeding Show Rules (All Breeds)

1. **Entries can be completed online (www.chisholmtraildorpers.com):**

2. Stalling will be horse stalls, 4 head per stall. If you would like additional stalls for sheep or tack room you can request at checkout for a cost of \$50 per stall.

3. Bedding (pine shavings) will be available for sale at check in. Shavings available are Suncoast 10 CF Large Flake Shavings for \$10/bag and pelleted shavings for \$10/bag. Pens are set up on packed dirt floors (brand new packed arena type dirt). **No Outside Bedding Allowed**, except straw. Straw is allowed for Rambouillet, Delaine-Merino & Other wool breeds.

4. All breeding sheep must be registered in the recognized flock books of their respective breeds by the day of check in (Friday, January 19, 2024). Sheep not carrying proper ear identification at time of show will be barred from competition. The official certificate of registration must be presented, and association ear tags or tattoos must correspond with the certificate. Applications of transfer or pending registrations will not be accepted. **All rams and ewes must have a scrapie tag in their ear.**

5. **Number of Animals:** There is no limit on the number of breeding sheep entries an exhibitor may enter in an individual class. Exhibitor may only enter one group entry per class per breed. Group class entries must be done at the time of registration.

6. **Awards:**

- Class Winners – Ribbons
- Group Winners - Rosettes
- Breed Champion & Reserve Breed Champion – Banner
- Supreme Champion, Reserve Supreme & 3rd Overall Ewe and Ram – Banner & Trophy

7. **Premier exhibitor:** Premier exhibitor awards will be awarded by breed to the exhibitor with the highest point count. Banners will be awarded to breed premier exhibitors. Prizes will be awarded to Overall Premier & Reserve Premier Exhibitor. Points will be awarded for all individual & group classes. Points are NOT awarded for champion and reserve champions.

- 1st place – 5 points
- 2nd place – 4 points
- 3rd place – 3 points
- 4th place – 2 points
- 5th place – 1 point

8. Heelers will be allowed in the Open Breeding Sheep Show.

9. **Out of state exhibitors:** All breeding Sheep must be accompanied by a current (within 30 days) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that meets all state requirements, issued by a certified veterinarian. Breeding rams 6 months of age or older from **out-of-state** must have a negative **Brucella Ovis ELISA test** within 30 days prior to being entered in a show, fair or exhibition, or they must come from a Brucella Ovis-free flock. The test results or herd number must be written on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

10. **Texas Exhibitors:** All breeding Sheep must be accompanied by a current (within 30 days) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that meets all state requirements, issued by a certified veterinarian.

11. Animals showing signs of ringworm, fungus or other communicable diseases will not be allowed to show and must be removed from show grounds.

Rambouillet, Southdown, Hampshire, Suffolk, ORB Rules

1. Fitting rules – Hampshire, Suffolk and Southdowns will need to be sheared above the knees and hocks and **no belly wool is allowed**. If you enter the check-in area with belly wool, you will be asked to shear it off before entering the ring. Rambouillet, Delaine-Merino, ORB and ORWB can be shown according to their breed standard.
2. Sheep will be entered in classes based on their teeth (except for the Fall 2023 lamb class, which will go by registration papers). Owners will be responsible for checking teeth prior to show and ensuring animals are entered in the correct class. The TOP 4 placing animals in each class will have their teeth checked by a show volunteer. **If any animal does not meet the class requirements, they will be disqualified and WILL NOT be moved to the appropriate age class. If you are not sure about your animal's age based on teeth, please find Edie or Zach.** They can check your animal's teeth and assist you with making sure your animal is entered in the correct class.
3. **Animals will show based on their teeth at the time of the show:**
 - a) Lamb class – Sheep carrying all milk teeth; Lambs showing either or part of their first pair of permanent incisors may not show in the lamb classes.
 - b) 2 tooth class – Sheep showing their first pair of permanent incisors. Sheep which have dropped their central pair of milk teeth and show one or more of their first pair of permanent incisors may show in the 2 tooth class.
 - c) Aged class - 4 to 8 tooth class – Sheep showing more than their first set of permanent incisors or have dropped one or more of their milk teeth from the second set of incisors. However, sheep must not have lost any of their 8 adult permanent incisors.
4. The Fall 2023 Lamb classes will be animals with birthdays from September 1, 2023 through October 31, 2023 on their registration papers.

1. **Entries can be completed online (www.chisholmtraildorpers.com):**

2. Stalling will be horse stalls, 4 head per stall. If you would like additional stalls for sheep or tack room you can request at checkout, and you will be billed closer to the event (due by 12/31/23).

3. Bedding (pine shavings) will be available for sale at check in. Shavings available are Suncoast 10 CF Large Flake Shavings for \$10/bag and pelleted shavings for \$10/bag. Pens are set up on packed dirt floors (brand new packed arena type dirt). **No Outside Bedding Allowed**, except straw. Straw is allowed for Rambouillet, & Other Wool breeds.

4. All breeding sheep must be registered in the recognized flock books of their respective breeds in the exhibitor's name by **January 19th, 2024**. Sheep not carrying proper ear identification at time of showing will be barred from competition. The official certificate of registration must be presented, and association ear tags or tattoos must correspond with the certificate. Applications of transfer or pending registrations will not be accepted. **Entries must be in the youth's name to qualify (partnerships between youth members are allowed). All rams and ewes must have a scrapie tag in their ear.**

5. **Number of Animals:** There is no limit on the number of breeding sheep entries an exhibitor may enter in an individual class. Exhibitor may only enter one group entry per class per breed. Group class entries must be done at the time of registration.

7. **Premier exhibitor:** Premier exhibitor awards will be awarded by breed to the exhibitor with the highest point count. Banners will be awarded to breed premier exhibitors. Buckles and Banners will be awarded to Overall Premier & Reserve Premier Exhibitor. Points will be awarded for all individual & group classes. Points are not awarded for champion and reserve champions.

8. **Heelers** will be allowed in the breeding show, if they are exhibitors in the show. If you are out of high school 18-21 you must be entered as an exhibitor in the show or on the registration papers as the owner or as partner on the papers to be able to heal with the exhibitor of said animal.

9. **Out of state exhibitors:** All breeding sheep must be accompanied by a current (within 30 days) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that meets all state requirements, issued by a certified veterinarian. Breeding rams 6 months of age or older from **out-of-state** must have a negative **Brucella Ovis ELISA test** within 30 days prior to being entered in a show, fair or exhibition, or they must come from a Brucella Ovis-free flock. The test results or herd number must be written on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

10. **Texas Exhibitors:** All breeding Sheep must be accompanied by a current (within 30 days) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that meets all state requirements, issued by a certified veterinarian.

11. Animals showing signs of ringworm, fungus or other communicable diseases will not be allowed to show and must be removed from show grounds.

2. **Breeding Ages:** For the purpose of this show, the following will apply regarding ages of breeding sheep: Tothing of sheep to determine the age class in which they are shown will be determined by the exhibitor before check-in. Sheep with the following tooth development at check-in time will show in the listed classes. The top 4 placing animals in each class will be toothed at the conclusion of each class. If the tothing does not match the class, the entry will be disqualified. **If you are not sure about your animal's age based on teeth, please find Amanda. She can check your animal's teeth and assist you with making sure your animal is entered in the correct class.**
3. **Animals will show based on their teeth at the time of the show:**
 - a. **Lamb class** – Sheep carrying all milk teeth; Lambs showing either or part of their first pair of permanent incisors may not show in the lamb classes.
 - b. **2 tooth class** – Sheep showing their first pair of permanent incisors. Sheep which have dropped their central pair of milk teeth and show one or more of their first pair of permanent incisors may show in the 2 tooth class.

3. All breeding sheep must be registered in the recognized flock books of their respective breeds. Sheep not carrying proper ear identification at time of showing will be barred from competition. The official certificate of registration must be presented, and association ear tags or tattoos must correspond with the certificate. Applications of transfer or pending registrations will not be accepted. **Dam may have been in a partnership with siblings residing in the same residence, but the lamb being shown must be registered in only one youth's name.**
4. Youth exhibitor must be able to walk the animal in the ring and control the head of the sheep without assistance.
5. Sheep must have been born to an ewe that was in the exhibitor's name at the time of conception. On the breeding certificate it must list the exhibitor as the breeder and the current owner.
6. Heelers will be allowed in the breeding show, if they are exhibitors in the show as well, and 21 and under.
7. 8. Animals showing signs of ringworm, fungus or other communicable diseases will not be allowed to show and must be removed from show grounds.

Purpose-this division is open to any registered breed of sheep. The goal is to showcase production females and their offspring, as applicable to sheep production, along with instilling good record keeping skills, money handling skills and public speaking in youth.

Record books of gains and associated costs to produce each animal will be kept and turned in via electronic format no later than October 18th. The production books are done online in google slides. Once entries are received a link to the form will be emailed to the exhibitor. They will have until the turn in deadline to work on the record book. Examples of the slides are listed at the bottom of these rules. Final placing and determination of "Champion producer" will be based off a combined score of the following.

Live Show Ewe & lamb (production based) 30%

Live Show Ewe & Lamb (placing in the age division) 30%

Record book 20%

Interview 20%

This show is open to all breeds of sheep, but they must be registered

The ewe and lamb(s) MUST be owned by the exhibitor or an immediate family member.

The ewe MUST have lambed after August 1, 2023 and MUST be the dam of the lamb(s) being shown

Lambs may be wethers, ewes or rams.

Sheep will be shown unhaltered(loose)

Live animals will be divided into workable classes at discretion of the show officials.

An exhibitor may show no more than (2) ewe/lamb projects in this division.

Ribbons will be awarded in each area of the competition thru 6th place.

A champion and reserve champion buckle will be awarded based on the combined score above.

Judging Points

Live Show Ewe & Lamb

Ewes will be properly washed and sheared for this competition, based on major show guidelines for their breed. Ewes can be clipped up to one month out or be carrying little hair/wool. Ewes will be judged from a commercial production standpoint. Lambs will be properly washed and sheared for this competition (if weaned from the ewe). Lambs will be judged from a commercial production standpoint. Cull faults will still be penalized as will breeding soundness issues. Animals will be shown unaltered (loose). This will also include placing the projects in a 1st – 5th place and awarding points for these placings as well.

Record Book

The record book will encompass data on the ewe and lamb. Weight gains of the lamb will be recorded by the youth in their record book, along with monetary output of care for both the ewe and the lamb. A panel of 2 people will judge the record books on neatness, ease of reading, knowledge of project in relation to a commercial setting and effort by the youth member in maintaining accurate flock records. The two judge's scores will be combined for the final record book score. Record books will be judged, and scores calculated before the start of the show. They will be displayed during the sheep production show.

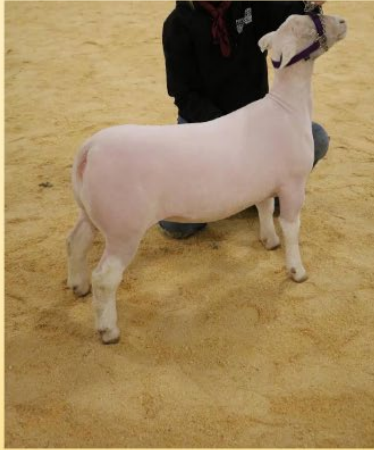
