Beliefs: The second coming of Christ; believers will be saved, but sects differ as to whether the unjust will be tortured in hell, annihilated or sleep eternally.

since they forbid alcohol, tea, coffee, tobacco and other stimulants, one tenth of income to church.

In 1852 a group separated to become the Reorganised Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints with it's headquarters in Missouri.
