WHEN: 3rd quarter of this school year (six sessions minimum, nine sessions recommended).

As you know, all seventh graders in MCPS this year will explore a Junior Achievement curriculum in World Studies classes, culminating with a trip and business life simulations at the Finance Park hosted by Thomas Edison High School of Technology. Conceived as a continuation of the Finance Park financial literacy program, the CONNECT Business Challenge will give all interested MCPS middle school students further opportunities to relate course work with real world experience and build confidence in the process. Participants will learn the basics of entrepreneurship, increase motivation and forge a positive relationship with their community.
