Friday, December 16th

Bahamas Bowl in Nassau, Bahamas

1★ OVER 44.5. † UAB 28 Miami, Oh 18. Miami, OH is 3-0 ATS in bowl games under Chuck Martin while UAB is led by interim coach Bryan Vincent who took over for Bill Clark in the summer. It will be Vincent's last game as the Blazers hired Trent Dillfer to be their next permanent coach. We expect them to play inspired as the players wrote an open letter to administration in support of Vincent. UAB RB DeWayne McBride (1,719 rush yards and 19 TD's) is the best player on the field and will have success here vs a Miami, Oh rush defense that was gashed in their final few games. Meanwhile, Miami's top rusher was their backup QB Aveon Smith who started most of the season with Brett Gabbert injured. UAB is No. 14 in ypp margin (+1.35) while Miami is No. 100 (-0.49). With that being said, we're not fond of laying doubles in bowl games and UAB was 0-6 ATS away from home this year. We will take the OVER as the early weather forecast looks decent.

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Cure Bowl in Orlando, FL

1★ OVER 55.5. † Troy 30 Utsa 28. A really good match-up between a pair of conference champions. It's also a missed opportunity as both teams would have been great "play-on" teams this bowl season. Both come in on 10-game win streaks and both are in the Top 25. Troy is better in ypp margin (No. 18 vs No. 39) and played the slightly tougher schedule (No. 95 vs No. 105) so that's why some early money has flipped them to favorites. The matchup to watch will be UTSA's No. 12 scoring offense vs Troy's No. 8 scoring defense. We lean OVER here as Troy's offense is coming off two of it's better performances of the season and UTSA has scored at least 30 on everyone but Texas this year.

Saturday, December 17th

Fenway Bowl in Boston, MA

1★ UNDER 40. † Louisville 21 Cincinnati 18. A lot of uncertainty for this game as both teams have interim coaches and backup QB's with a lot of opt-outs. Of course, the main story is that former Cincinnati head coach Scott Satterfield has left to take the job at Louisville although he won't participate here. Cincinnati is led by interim Kerry Coombs who will be retained under Satterfield while Deion Branch will lead Louisville. Cincy has the better stats (No. 10 vs No. 40 in ypp margin) but Louisville played the tougher schedule (No. 29 vs No. 76). Weather could play a factor and we've seen money come in on the UNDER. Plus both defenses are near the Top 20 in scoring.

Celebration Bowl in Atlanta, GA

1★ NC Central (+14.5). † Jackson St 34 NC Central 20. 12-0 Jackson St is clearly the superior team with a +27 ppg scoring margin and +217 ypp margin. Meanwhile, 9-2 NC Central is +18 ppg and +116 ypp. There is a lot of distractions for Jackson St with Deion Sanders and many players coaching and playing in their final game before moving to Colorado next season. Jackson St was 0-3 ATS down the stretch and did not play well in the bowl game last year.

New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque, NM

1★ BYU (+3.5). † Smu 33 Byu 31. These two teams played similar schedules in terms of strength and BYU was No. 35 in ypp margin while SMU was No. 64. So why is SMU laying more than 3 here? Well, BYU could be without QB Jaren Hall who has not practiced much since the regular season finale. BYU HC Kalani Sitake does have the bowl experience edge (3-2 SU/2-3 ATS) while SMU HC Rhett Lashlee is coaching his first bowl. SMU's outstanding WR Rashee Rice (1,355 yards) has opted out of the game. Both defenses rank No. 100 or worse in yards per play and scoring but we've seen money on the UNDER. Like most bowl games, there is a lot of uncertainty here. We think the Jaren Hall is over-rated and over-priced so we lean BYU even if Hall doesn't play.

LA Bowl in Inglewood, CA

2★ Fresno St (-3.5). † **Fresno St 30 Washington St 24.** Fresno St head coach Jeff Tedford is 7-3 SU in bowl games while Jake Dickert had a disappointing bowl loss to Central Michigan last year. Fresno St was a different team down the stretch. After a brutal 1-4 SU/0-5 ATS start, the Bulldogs have on 8 straight (6-2 ATS) and much of that coincides with the return of QB Jake Haener who missed a few games early in the season. Fresno St is better in the stats (No. 49 vs No. 83 in ypp margin) but Washington St did play the much tougher schedule (No. 36 vs No. 111). However, the Cougars will be without 3 of their top 4 WR's, a few defensive starters and both coordinators. All the early money is on Fresno St and we agree.

Lending Tree Bowl in Mobile, AL

3★ Southern Miss (-6). † **Southern Miss 29 Rice 20.** We expect both teams to be excited to be playing in a bowl game. The 5-7 Owls are making their first bowl game since 2014 and got in because of high APR scores. Starting QB TJ McMahon has not been practicing as AJ Padgett has been taking the first team reps. Rice struggled without McMahon in the last 2.5 games since his injury (scored a combined 34 points). Southern Miss is better in ypp margin (No. 85 vs No. 105) and have been underrated all season (9-3 ATS).

Las Vegas Bowl, Las Vegas, NV

1★ Florida (+10). † **Oregon St 30 Florida 22.** The two teams are close in ypp margin (Oregon St No. 33 vs Florida No. 37) but the Beavers do have bigger edges in ypg (No. 39 vs No. 59) and ppg margins (No. 26 vs No. 65). The Gators played the tougher schedule (No. 9 vs No. 34). So why is the SEC team catching double-digits here? First, Florida QB Anthony Richardson has declared for the NFL Draft. Florida's backup was kicked off the team and Jack Miller will get the start here. Miller is a 4-star recruit and was at Ohio St originally so we don't think he is chopped liver. Florida will also be without their top OL, top LB and a pair of WR's. Oregon St was 10-2 ATS this year. That's why we have a huge spread here. However, Florida head coach Billy Napier is on an incredible 17-3-1 ATS as an underdog.

Frisco Bowl, Frisco, TX

1★ Boise st (-10.5). † **Boise St 34 North Texas 23.** Boise St did play the slightly tougher schedule and have the edges in the stats (No. 21 vs No. 44 in ypp margin). We also have a North Texas team that is being led by an interim coach in Phil Bennett (long-time DC and former SMU HC). Boise's season turned around when QB Hank Bachmeier hit the transfer portal and they fired their OC. Insert QB Taylen Green who is more of a run-threat (462 rush yards 6.8 ypc and 8 TD's) and long-time coach Dirk Koetter and the Broncos went 7-2 SU/6-3 ATS since that 2-2 start. North Texas is playing close to home but we lean Boise here as North Texas was over-matched vs the better teams on their schedule losing by 20 and 21 to UAB and UTSA down the stretch.

Monday, December 19th

Myrtle Beach Bowl in Conway, SC

1★ Marshall (-10). † **Marshall 27 Connecticut 15.** A lot of people are going to like a 9-3 ATS Connecticut team that should be amped to be playing in a bowl game. We can't get over the disparities in the stats here. Marshall out-gained their opponents by 113 ypg (No. 16 in the country). UConn, despite a 6-6 record was outgained by 85 ypg (No. 118). Marshall is No. 32 in ypp margin, UConn, No. 106. Marshall is No. 37 in scoring margin, UConn, No. 105. The best player on the field is Marshall's Khalen Laborn who ran for 1,418 yards and 16 TD's. It's tough laying doubles with a low total but that's the only way we could look in this game.

Tuesday, December 20th

Potato Bowl in Boise, ID

1★ Eastern Michigan (+3.5). † **San Jose St 28 Eastern Michigan 25.** What happened to San Jose St down the stretch? This is a team that enters on a 6-game ATS losing streak by an average of 11 ppg. QB Chevan Cordeiro has a nice 20-to-4 TD-to-INT ratio but San Jose St can't run averaging just 92 ypg and their OL allowed 40 sacks. Meanwhile, Eastern Michigan won 8 games for the first time since 1987 and are looking for their first bowl win since 1987. The Eagles are 0-4 SU in bowl games under HC Chris Creighton but are 3-1 ATS. San Jose St is better in the stats (No. 52 vs No. 87 in ypp margin) but EMU has played better away from home this year (No. 60 vs San Jose St's No. 68 in ypp margin on the road). EMU is also on a 35-10-1 ATS run as an underdog.

Boca Raton Bowl in Boca Raton, FL

1★ Toledo (-5). † **Toledo 30 Liberty 24.** Liberty looked like they opted out of the season after upsetting Arkansas. The Flames lost their last 3 games of the season outright as double-digit favorites failing to cover by 29 ppg. In the regular season finale, they lost by 35 points as a 24-point favorite. Failing to cover the spread by 59 points in a single game is historically bad. It's the worst result in any CFB game in 4 years. It's in the Top 10 worst performances since 1990! With Hugh Freeze gone, they have an interim coach and will be taking on a Toledo team that is already better than them in the stats (No. 30 vs No. 47 in ypp margin). We would be stronger on Toledo here but their head coach Jason Candle is on a 0-4 SU/ATS in bowl games. Three of those four bowl losses came as a 7-point or more favorite. Candle has amazingly lost 7 games the last two years outright as a TD-plus favorite.

Wednesday, December 21st

New Orleans Bowl in New Orleans, LA

2★ South Alabama (-4). † **South Alabama 31 Western Kentucky 24.** Breaking news on Tuesday afternoon is that WKU QB Austin Reed has withdrawn his name from the transfer portal and will return to WKU. Obviously, he's worth several points to the spread (WKU went from +8 to +4). However, we're not sure how locked in WKU is here with uncertainty from their best player (Reed 4,340 pass yards and a 41-9 ratio). The Hilltoppers have had several players enter the portal including a pair of OL and their top 2 TE's. This is one of the better defenses they will have faced all season as South Alabama ranks No. 12 in total D and No. 14 in scoring D. South Alabama is 10-2 SU and their two losses are by a combined 5 points to UCLA and Troy. This is a very good and very consistent team.

FAQ: How do I play your star-rated picks in the bowl issue(s)?

First, we will admit that most of the 1-star plays would not be included in a regular season issue as they are leans only. However, most of you will want action on every single bowl game for a variety of reasons and that is why we put a star-rated pick on every bowl game whether it is the side or the total. If you are someone that only likes to take part in a few games each week, then we would recommend you only play the 3-star and 4-star picks as they are clearly the strongest. If you are someone that likes to play 5-6 games a week, then the 2-stars are certainly worth your while.

Week 16 Computer Projected Lines for Every CFB Game

For the past six seasons we have posted computer projected lines for every game on Wednesday. Games where there was of difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 421-355-12 (54%) clip! So far this season those games are 43-38-2. Keep in mind, these computer lines are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage. The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.

2. Interim coaches are 30-35-1 ATS in bowl games since 2005.
3. Since 2005, double-digit favorites in bowl games are 38-49 ATS.
4. Liberty failed to cover the spread by 59 points in their last game. The Flames were 24-point favorites and lost by 35. That was the single-game worst performance in any CFB game since 2018. It's also a Top 10 worst performance in any FBS game since 1990!
5. UAB went 0-6 ATS away from home this year.
6. Florida head coach Billy Napier is on a 17-3-1 ATS run as an underdog!
7. Eastern Michigan is on a 35-10-1 ATS run as an underdog since 2016.

Thursday, December 15th

San Francisco 22 SEATTLE 20. The 49ers just might be the hottest team in football right now. They have now won 6 straight (5-1 ATS) and embarrassed us on these pages last week in their blowout win over Tampa Bay. Now they face a Seattle team that is 0-4 ATS their last 4 and running out of steam. Seems like an easy winner right? Well, this would be Brock Purdy's first road start and we're hearing whispers that he isn't healthy. Lean Seattle and UNDER for now.

Saturday, December 17th

CLEVELAND 20 Baltimore 17. We've seen a ton of money come in on the UNDER here as the weather forecast isn't great. As of press-time we're not sure if QB Tyler Huntley will get cleared for the Ravens as he was concussed in the Ravens win over the Steelers last week (Lamar Jackson is still out). The Browns offense has been terrible with Deshaun Watson under center the last couple of games and we cashed fading the Browns last week. However, the dire QB situation for the Ravens has us leading Cleveland here.

MINNESOTA 27 Indianapolis 23. We've been saying all season how overrated Minnesota is and last week it finally caught up to them in the loss to the Lions. Minnesota is No. 27 in ypp margin and rank No. 21 in DVOA despite a 10-3 record. Indy is No. 15 in ypp margin and are coming off a bye. We're a little concerned though with how they finished that Dallas game (outscored 33-0 in 4Q). Do they continue to play hard for the interim? We lean OVER.

2★ Buffalo 26 Miami 17. Buffalo has revenge for losing 21-19 at Miami in a game where they had a 497-212 yard edge. We know the stat geeks love the Dolphins because they are No. 5 in ypp margin and No. 8 in DVOA while playing a Top 10 schedule. The reality is they are over-priced in the market at 2-7-1 ATS in their last 10 games. Early weather forecast calls for temps in the 20's. We like Buffalo. It's also Miami's 3rd straight road game and they are on a short week.

Sunday, December 18th

2★ WASHINGTON 23 N.Y. Giants 17. This game got flexed out to SNF. Raise your hand if you had that happening prior to the season. These two just played to a 20-20 tie in New York two weeks ago. Both teams are not as good as their records indicate. Washington is No. 23 in ypp margin while the Giants are No. 26. Washington has had a bye since that Giants game while the G-Men were crushed by Philly last week. Washington is 6-1-1 SU/ATS in their last 8 and are in better form.

NEW ORLEANS 23 Atlanta 19. It's a rematch of a 27-26 New Orleans win in Week 1 which saw yet another big blown lead by Atlanta. The Falcons have really fallen off since their hot start as they are just 1-6 ATS in their last 7 games. Meanwhile, the Saints have been disappointing all year despite a No. 7 ranking in ypp margin. Both teams come in off a bye and we lean with the UNDER which is 7-3 in Atlanta's last 10 games and 5-1 in New Orleans' last 6.

N.Y. JETS 23 Detroit 21. We know the Bengals and 49ers are red-hot but don't overlook the these Detroit Lions who are on a 6-0 ATS run going 5-1 SU. DVOA now has them No. 11. As of press-time we're not sure if Mike white will start for the Jets or if it will be Joe Flacco. Both teams need a win to keep their playoff hopes alive. We just trust the home team more here.

Kansas City 31 HOUSTON 18. Last week Houston covered the biggest point-spread of the season in their near shocking upset of Dallas. While dead last in ypp margin and DVOA, we don't think they are historically bad despite a 1-11-1 mark. Obviously, Kansas City is one of the best teams in the NFL but they don't inspire a lot of confidence as far as value with their 4-8 ATS mark since Week 1. **Philadelphia 30 CHICAGO 21.** Philadelphia not only has the best record at 12-1 but the Eagles also rank No. 1 in ypp margin and are No. 1 in DVOA. They've also covered 3 straight. The Bears come in off 4 straight losses SU/ATS. Totals' players note the OVER has cashed in 7 straight Chicago games and is 7-1 in Philly's last 8 games. That's where our lean is.

CAROLINA 19 Pittsburgh 18. The Panthers are playing well with a 6-1 ATS mark in their last 7 and remarkably in the terrible NFC South, they are still in the hunt. Meanwhile, Pittsburgh's quest to keep head coach Mike Tomlin's winning season streak alive took a major hit last week in the upset loss to the Ravens. With a low total, we love the Steelers in a teaser despite their QB question marks.

Dallas 26 JACKSONVILLE 23. Dallas is 10-3 SU and rank No. 5 in ypp margin and No. 4 in DVOA. Yet, the Jags are taking a ton of money in the market place here. Jacksonville got the upset win over Tennessee last week much to our dismay. Despite a 5-8 record, the market prices them like an average team with their No. 16 mark in ypp margin and No. 18 mark in DVOA. We lean with them here.

DENVER 18 Arizona 17. Colt McCoy will get the start here for the Cardinals after Kyler Murray tore his ACL on MNF. Meanwhile, the Broncos actually showed some life last week in a loss to the Chiefs. That's the second week in a row they covered as a big underdog. Now they find themselves favored as they are 0-4 ATS in that role this season. We lean with Arizona here especially in a teaser with such a low total.

L.A. CHARGERS 26 Tennessee 23. Tennessee really disappointed us on these pages last week as their banged up defense couldn't hold up vs the Jags. Meanwhile, the Chargers got a big win for their playoffs hopes while upsetting Miami. We lean OVER with both teams dealing with injuries on the defensive side.

Cincinnati 24 TAMPA BAY 21. Obviously, two teams heading in opposite directions. The Bucs are now on a 1-9-1 ATS run after getting blown out by the 49ers last week. Meanwhile, the Bengals are on an incredible 10-1 ATS run and are clearly now one of the six best teams in the NFL. We were right with the Bengals last week and dead wrong with the Bucs. We don't see much value here.

1★ New England 23 LAS VEGAS 20. New England is off the MNF win and cover vs the Cardinals while the Raiders have extra rest after playing the Rams last Thursday. We're not sure how the Raiders will respond after blowing their 4th big lead of the season. They are basically losing to guys off the street at this point when you look at what Jeff Saturday and Baker Mayfield did to them. The Patriots have Cincinnati, Miami and Buffalo on deck. They need this game like blood if they want to make the playoffs. This would be a stronger play if not for the rest disadvantage but note NE is staying out west this week.

Monday, December 19th

GREEN BAY 23 L.A. Rams 16. Baker Mayfield will get the start here for the Rams after leading the dramatic comeback vs the Raiders last week. The Packers are off a bye. The last time we saw them, they were doing what they do best and that's winning and covering vs the Bears. Despite a 5-8 record, the Packers are No. 17 in ypp margin and No. 15 in DVOA which means they are an average team. The banged up Rams are not ranking No. 27 in both ypp and DVOA. We could only tease GB down to -1.
