PONDERINGS FROM PASTOR CATHIE

To the Christians of Community Presbyterian Church of West Fargo: Grace to you and peace.

It is Fall, the autumn of our year. Today it is sunny, breezy, and warm. By the time you are reading this, the weather will have changed. Weather is predictable, to a point. We get used to the changing weather pattern, we can even find ways to enjoy the unpredictability of the weather!

We have choices each day. We can choose to be crabby and growly, or we can choose a positive appreciation for life itself. Each time I meet with families who have lost a loved one and officiate at a funeral, I am reminded of how grateful I am for each day I wake up in the morning. When I listen to the stories of life and then death, I realize how fragile our lives are. No one,

not even Jesus, knows the timing of the end of God's creation or our own life.

This week I learned that a friend from Sioux City died as she was walking along the road near her home. A pick-up truck hit her, and she died instantly. When she left her house, all was well.

Now she is with God and all is well, for Sue. No warning. It just happened. All is not well with her family.

The weather shifted dramatically for her family and friends at the unexpectedness of her death. When the weather changes, we change. When we lose a loved one, we change.

Whatever the change might be, from the weather to losing a loved one, or a different job, retirement, or a move to a different home, we humans experience changes in different ways. Adjusting to the weather can be as simple as adding a coat, or deciding not to wear a coat. Very different responses are called for when we experience more traumatic situations such as experiencing hurricanes, tornadoes, fires, earthquakes, or losing a loved one.

Weather changes, life changes, our situations change. Do you ever wonder just how we are to handle this change, as Christians?

We will be reading the Book of Jonah in November. Jonah is an example of one of God's children going off on their own. God calls Jonah to go to Nineveh, and he goes a different direction. It took a while for Jonah to hear and accept the change God had called him to go. Of the Minor Prophets we have been reading, I think Jonah is most like us! When God calls us, it usually is to do something different, to do something that requires change. As humans, we often fight the change, doing everything we can think of to not have to change.

God does call us to follow and to make changes. The Psalms are a great example of the people of God lamenting the changes in their lives, and then they quit fighting the change, and praise God! One third of the psalms are considered "laments." There are individual la-

> ments and communal laments. Examples of the laments in Psalms are in chapters 3, 5, 6, 7, 38, 39, 40-44 and more. You will find the lament psalms include both complaints and praise to God.

The Psalms provide us examples of how we can deal with change. It is ok to be an-

gry at God, then we remember how much God loves us...so much that God gave us his Son to die for us, to forgive us, and give us grace. When you are struggling with change, remember that we are to forgive others and to give them the same grace that God gives us.



This does not include the mortgage payment of \$3,146.54. The balance in the building fund account is \$3,987.76, these funds will cover the mortgage payment for November.

To date we have designated funds of \$3,247.50 to pay our assessed per capita for 2017. Total Per Capita amount for 2017 is \$8,228.00 meaning we still owe \$4,980.50 for our assessed portion.

Per Capita amount for 2017 is \$44.00 for each confirmed member. The unpaid balance at the end of the year is paid out of the church general fund. Please mark on your check or envelope Per Capita.

If we give generously to others and for the building of God's kingdom, He will find ways to bless us. We can never out give God. Jesus tells us to "give, and it will be given to you" (Luke 6:38). Our giving will reap blessings.
