In September, Susan Sato from Easy Piecing, will be coming to CHQ to teach us about Sashiko/Boro stitching.

Some day our new quilts will be old quilts. Our art is steeped in current traditions which translates into our own documentation of history; design, comfort and love, maybe someday, they become a window into 2022.

Sashiko books, threads, tools, stencils and patterns will also be discussed. Basic stitching techniques will be covered for the whole class. Individual attention will be given to each student so that you emerge with confidence in your

stitching. This class is great for beginners and works well as a wonderful take along project.

The Boro Workshop Students will learn how to layer old and new fabrics on to a background to create an organic Boro base and use Sashiko stitches to anchor it all

together. Scrap fabrics work best, even fabric with holes! Nothing is wasted. This workshop is for everyone. It will all be done by hand, no sewing machines needed. It's easy, no rules, and you can use all of those scraps!



"Quilts in the Mill 2022" Acquisitions Procedures

The Acquisitions Committee for the "Quilts in the Mill 2022" is now soliciting quilts. We strongly encourage all members in good standing to submit quilts. A member in good standing must have dues paid in full, donate three (3) handmade items to the show boutique or made a baby quilt, and sell 20 raffle tickets. In addition, we will not accept quilts that have been shown at previous CHQ shows, and the quilt must be made or owned by a current member.

Acquisition forms should be submitted for each quilt that you would like to have hung in the show. The deadline for submitting the completed forms is Sunday, August 21st. Your quilt does not have to be completed to submit the form, but it must be completed to hang in the show! Forms can be emailed to Andrea Cavallaro, <u>andreakcav@gmail.com</u> (digital photo also attached), mailed to her at 58 Hogback Road, Pittstown, NJ 08867, or submitted at the guild meetings. Please start entering your quilts as soon as possible as there is a great amount of data entry that accompanies each quilt and it must be completed by the acquisition committee by September 1st.

1. Each quilt entered must have an individual acquisition form. We will try our best to hang all quilts entered, but we may not have room for all, so we ask that you prioritize each entry, from #1 being of highest priority up to the number you have put into the show. Challenge and workshop quilts are excluded from prioritizing since all of them will be hung. Place a C (for challenge) or a W (for workshop) in the priority space instead of a number. Also, check off whether you will allow the quilt to be draped.

2. A **COLOR** 3" X 5" photograph must accompany your form in the space provided on the form.

3. Any forms received after the August 21st deadline will not be accepted in order to allow time for the programs to be printed.

4. On the back of the quilt there should be a label with your information on it. Also, make sure you have a 4" sleeve on the top back. Miniature quilt sleeves may be smaller. Sleeve instructions:

5. Quilts are to be delivered on September 27th between the hours of 9:00 am to 5:00 pm at the Hunterdon County Library, 314 State Route 12, Flemington. Each piece entered in the show should be in separate cloth bags (pillowcases) that are labelled with your name and phone number.

6. Quilts must be picked up on Sunday, October 2nd, at the mill, between 6 pm and

7pm. No one will be allowed into the mill until all quilts are taken down and organized. Please make arrangements if you are unable to pick up your quilts. Any quilts not picked up will be taken home by a quilt member. Quilts will not be released without a claim ticket. You may pick up another person's quilt if you have their tickets.

During the June, 2022 general CHQ meeting, three Guild members were approved by the general CHQ membership and by the CHQ Board to serve as a Nominating Committee for the purpose of filling the CHQ Executive Board positions that will expire at the end of 2022. The committee's objective is to prepare a ballot of nominees for the five positions outlined below. The persons elected to these positions will serve 2-year terms beginning in January, 2023. The Nominating Committee will present the list of nominees to the general membership at the October Guild meeting. Voting will take place during the November general meeting and the new CHQ Executive Board will be installed during the December general meeting.

As this time the Nominating Committee invites and encourages all CHQ members to give serious consideration to one of the positions described below. Serving at the CHQ Board level gives members a wonderful opportunity to be instrumental in guild decision-making, enables a greater understanding of the workings of the Guild and facilitates enhanced interactions with all Guild members. If you personally cannot serve the Guild in this manner but know of someone who might be an interested candidate, you are also welcome to submit their name(s). Names will only be placed on the nomination list upon approval of the individual(s). CHQ ELECTED BOARD POSITIONS TO BE FILLED:

President

Presides at all CHQ Board and general guild meetings; prepares monthly CHQ Board Meeting agenda; appoints all Chairpersons of the Standing and Ad Hoc committees with advice and consent of the CHQ Board; serves as ex-officio member of all committees; is responsible for preparation and submission of the President's monthly letter.

Second Vice President

Assists First Vice President with organization of Guild workshops/programs and monthly guild meeting/events. Training/mentoring for one year, then moving into First Vice President's role in the second year. First Vice President is responsible for planning/executing creative informative events, educational workshops/programs for guild and leading/organizing the Guild speakers/events.

Duties include finding teachers/speakers, scheduling, contacting, payment, transportation/hotel considerations (if necessary) and workshop/program/meeting set up/coordination.

Second Vice President performs the duties of the First Vice President is their absence. (Currently, Jude McCormick is our First VP and Anne Oswald is Second VP; Anne will become First VP in 2023; this is an opportunity to work with Anne in 2023).

Recording Secretary

Records the minutes of general and CHQ Board Meetings; emails draft to the CHQ Board Members for review, finalizes and submits minutes at next monthly CHQ Board meeting for approval.

Corresponding Secretary

Handles all CHQ correspondence requested by the CHQ Board; sends 'good will' cards to members as warranted; may, on occasion, perform other considerations per CHQ Board approval.

Treasurer

Maintains accurate Guild financial records; receives and deposits monies for all Guild activities to the Guild bank account; prepares a monthly report outlining receipts, disbursements and current account balance to the CHQ Board and members; submits an annual budget (November) and a budget status report (June); remits dues and other financial obligations to any organization to which the Guild is affiliated; follows IRS and state and local regulations with respect to operation of a non-profit organization; upon request, the Treasurer to produce all necessary documentation for a complete audit.

MINIS IN THE MILL

One of the successful fundraisers held during our CHQ biennial quilt show has been a raffle of mini quilts made by the guild members. The raffle is conducted in tricky-tray fashion, with the drawing on the afternoon of the last day of the show. It's a great opportunity for members, other quilters and non-quilters to take a chance at taking home a small piece(s) of quilted art made by CHQ members. In the past we've raffled 50-60 mini quilts per show.

Please consider making at least one Mini for our Courthouse Quilters Guild Show (September 30 - October 2). Here are the rules for Mini construction:

1. Your Mini can represent any theme and can be traditional, modern or an art quilt, either from a pattern or your own creation.

2. Your Mini can be as small as 6"x6" (minimum) or as large as 24"x24" (maximum).

3. No cheater cloth.

4. Your Mini can be machine or hand quilted; no tied quilts.

5. Your Mini should have a label with quilt title (optional), your name, county, state, date and Courthouse Quilters. That way the lucky winner will know all about their new quilt and who made it. It's not necessary to add a hanging sleeve.

6. Your Mini must be handed in by no later than the August meeting. This will give the committee time to photograph the Minis and finalize other details.
