"Religious Freedom?"

"Because of this, God gave them over to shameful lusts. Even their women exchanged natural sexual relations for unnatural ones. In the same way the men also abandoned natural relations with women and were inflamed with lust for one another. Men committed shameful acts with other men, and received in themselves the due penalty for their error." (Romans 1: 26-27)

It's been interesting to see the extent of the outrage directed at the Indiana legislature for passing the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) a few days ago, and at Governor Mike Pence for signing it into law! The law was passed to protect individuals and business owner's from being forced to violate their religious convictions or lose their job, business, or savings to as a result of government prosecution.

There have already been a number of real life cases where a Christian owner of a bakery, florist, photography studio, etc... declined a request to provide their services for a gay wedding because they felt participating in it would violate Biblical teachings, and as a result have lost their business and were assessed heavy fines.

<u>Washington:</u> Florist Barronell Stutzman fined by the state for not providing flowers for a "gay" wedding. Now her home and personal savings are at risk.



New Mexico: Photographer Elaine Huguenin was ordered by the state to give a lesbian \$7,000 for declining to take pictures of a lesbian wedding. Oregon: Aaron and Melissa Klein were fined \$150,000 by the state for refusal to bake a cake for a lesbian wedding based on religious objections. Kentucky: Blaine Adamson was ordered by the city of Lexington to undergo 'sensitivity training" for refusing to print T-shirts for a gay pride festival.

The Indiana law seeks to protect these Christian business owners from these suits. The law doesn't mean for instance that a baker can bar homosexuals from the bakery, or that they can refuse to wait on them or sell bakery products to them. It just means the baker doesn't have to participate in a same-sex wedding by providing a wedding cake. A photographer cannot refuse to take pictures of any homosexuals. But he / she can refuse to photograph a gay wedding if it violates his religious convictions.

Homosexual activists groups are outraged over Indiana's law. Some businesses are threatening to pull out of, or boycott the state of Indiana over the law. "Angie's List" has vowed to cancel a planned expansion in Indiana as a result of the law. The outrage is ironic since 19 states, including Louisiana, already have laws similar to the one Indiana just passed.

The Indiana law is a good law and a needed law. As for marriage, I'll side with Jesus' definition of marriage in Matthew 19:4-5, "Haven't you read," Jesus replied, "that at the beginning the Creator made them male and female,' and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'?"




