LAUDATO SI': ON CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME

As the last bulletin message for 2021, the Laudato Si' Circle would like to thank you for your encouragement and support in our first year of formation. We especially thank Fr Aloysius for embracing our ideas and guiding our work as we took first steps towards becoming a Laudato Si' Parish. Reflecting back on 2021, the Circle met mostly in lockdown via Zoom to creatively collaborate on new initiatives. We felt inspired to dual action: firstly in sharing Pope Francis' Laudato Si' message of hope and secondly in proactively creating a Laudato Si' parish. Some of our achievements in 2021 included:

-Celebrating Laudato Si Week (May), Refugee Week (June) and NAIDOC Week (July) in a special way through the Sunday liturgies. Celebrating the Season of Creation (September) in lockdown with a special online prayer service.

Joining the global Interfaith community by displaying a new banner "Care for Creation" on the Bell St side of Church and calling for greater climate change ambition.

We also started a monthly gardening group and received a small grant from Darebin Council for environmental initiatives.

-We raised awareness of Laudato Si' through weekly bulletin notices, our choir rejoiced in hymns of praise for God's Creation and one of our members published a book on climate change!

Lastly but not least, we were among the first parishes to sign up to Pope Francis' new Laudato Si' Action Platform.
