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help meet the needs of our students. It is important that our voices are heard on these committees. Please consider joining one. The committees for this year are: Equity, Curriculum and Technology, RTI/AIS-School District Improvement, PDP and SCD, Mental Health & Wellness, and Health & Safety.

F. COVID NYS Paid Leave

Employees are still able to access the NYS paid leave for 3 instances. If they have already used it three times, then they will have to use sick days. The COVID form can be found in your main office and should be filled out and returned to Eileen Zeppa or the LBAttendance email with the positive lab test. Home tests are not accepted. Employees should isolate through at least day 5 (day 0 is the day symptoms appeared or the date the specimen was collected for the positive test for people who are asymptomatic). They can return to work (as long as symptoms are improving) and should wear a mask through day 10. If symptoms are not improving they may need to stay out longer, and will be paid up to 10 days.

G. Vote YES on Prop 1

This year, New York State has a ballot proposition that would allow small cities to borrow money at the same rates as other districts. This will have immediate impacts on school districts representing almost 200,000 students across the state which will now be able to receive more funding for public education. H. Study Money - Winter 12/8/23 and Summer 5/10/24

Those who applied and were approved for Fall Study Money will appear on the November 14th Board of Education agenda. Members with permanent or professional certification may apply for up to \$1,750 in study money per semester. I. Annual Turn-In of Sick Days

If you have accumulated at least 75 sick days and wish to exercise your option of selling back unused sick days earned this year (up to 12 or 14 if you worked at Summer School or Extended School Year) you must submit a "Request for Payment in Exchange for Accumulated Unused Sick Days" form to the HR Department. The teacher must not have been absent more than 6 days during the school year for which he/she shall claim eligibility for this payment.

III. Executive Vice President's Report—Karen Bloom

A. APPR

- 1. You should have received something stating who your evaluators will be for this school year. If you did not, please contact your immediate supervisor and let them know.
- 2. Please take an active role in the observation process. Keep in mind that the Danielson framework that we use is based on best practice and observable measures. You should not see opinions from your evaluation team. Be sure to address issues in your post observation conferences.
- **3.** Our APPR handbook is on our website. You can find all timelines, conversion charts and percentages here.
- 4. Feel free to contact me if you have specific concerns regarding APPR.

B. Health & Safety

- 1. We had our first H & S meeting today 10/23. The following items were discussed
 - a) Early Dismissal Drill: Mr. DeVito had sent communication to families via a letter in the opening of school documents that shared the date of the drill as well as the communication methods that would be tested. The purpose is to test both communication: email, text and phone, as well as transportation. The district drill is this Wednesday 10/25. However, the HS will need to participate in another one on 11/22 due to a lack of communication with the Island Park Schools.
 - **b)** School Bus Stop Arm Cameras: It was discussed that many people are having trouble seeing the stopped buses across six lanes of traffic. Although, technically the law is to stop on both sides of the street, LB police are not being as strict with the opposite side stopping.
 - c) **Reunification**: This year will be used to discuss reunification with staff and to decide how we will best conduct these drills at each building. Next year, we will plan to have a reunification drill, likely attached to one of our current drills.
 - **d) Situational Awareness Training**: Admin will receive training which they will turn-key to their faculties. This will likely be followed by having homeland security join each building for a drill.
 - e) **Transportation**: There was a discussion of bus inspections that take place when a coach bus is used rather than a school bus. In addition to checking all ratings and abstracts prior to hiring, all buses are checked by our mechanics and must pass a safety inspection before arriving at the school.

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- **f) Middle East Crisis**: NCPD are monitoring social media to make sure that no threats are coming into Nassau districts. In addition, they have provided more police presence on campuses and suggest that we review all safety plans.
- **g) Balloon Mission**: Keep your eyes out from your building principals regarding a program that recycles old balloons rather than allowing them to get into our waterways and pollute the environment.
- h) Lido Complex:
 - (1) Boiler update is extensive and I will happily share it with whoever would like more details. Bottom line is that it should be completed for next year's heating season.
 - (2) There was also a discussion about the Lido Multipurpose room windows.
- i) High School:
 - (1) Library shelves were rearranged in order to provide places to go during a lockdown drill.
 - (2) There was an extensive conversation regarding the dysfunctional cameras in the building as well as other parts of the district. It seems that A+ may not be providing all the help that we need. The district will need to check cameras regularly and decide if we need a new company to better support our needs. It seems that much of the video gets "skipped" due to a lack of server space and we will need to upgrade to cloud storage for the problem to be fixed.
- **j)** Medical Documentation for Drill Exemption: Teachers or staff who are medically exempt from participating in drills will need to provide a doctor's note in order to be exempt. Notes should be given to Dr. Natali in Human Resources.
- **k) COVID 19 Guidelines**: Things are still the same as they were last year. We requested that the most current guidelines be re-sent to all members in the district to clarify the details of testing, using COVID days and when to return.
- I) Long Beach Flooding: We discussed our most recent flood and how quickly the conditions changed on the roads. Despite the fact that people felt an early dismissal was warranted, that is not always the best way to proceed. Many students would have been released with no parents home. However, Mr. DeVito did give each building approval to work with staff members and allow people to leave early if there are major travel concerns.
- **m)** District Policy for Classroom Use of Pronouns for Transgender Students: Dr. Gallagher shared some of the recent guidelines that were put together by NYSED. Although we do not have a district policy, we are using these recommendations and best practices. She also shared these guidelines at the administrative council, so hopefully the principals will send it out shortly!

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


