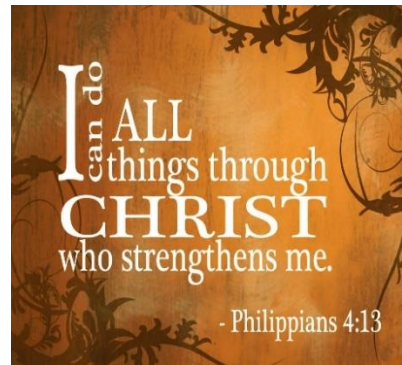

The ladies made a commitment to supply the REACH, Inc. of Cherokee County domestic violence shelter with cleaning supplies and laundry detergent. If you have items of clothing, children books, etc. to donate please place them in the bin provided in the pantry area or you can take them to the REACH office located behind the thrift store on HWY 64. We can always use some small tote bags and small travel size items to fill them with, e.g. combs, hand sanitizer, toothbrush, travel size toothpaste, deodorant, etc. for their clients. Recommended size for the tote bags is 9”X9”. Put them on the table in the pantry and we will fill them as time permits.

There is also a small donation jar on the table in the back of the church if you would prefer to give money. If you would like to donate on a recurrent basis, please fill out the card on the back table. You can take it directly by the office or give it to Lula to take for you.

Other fundraisers are always being planned. Fundraisers are needed to supplement government grants. Let's continue to help them keep up the good work and keep them in your prayers.

Often the victims leave home with only the clothes on their back,

“Our History is Our Strength”

Pantry Items



Please let Roy Stephenson know if you know of someone who has a need.

Please check the expiration dates of food items for a long shelf-life for it may be awhile before an item is donated, but if you know of a specific need please let us know. If the item is close to expiring Lula will pull them off the shelves and Roy will take them to the homeless shelter, if no family, individual or special requests have been made. **NOTE: Our pantry is small, so we try not to over stock** and we don’t have anyone to check the pantry daily or give out items. **Currently, we are running low on pasta, e.g. spaghetti, Mac & Cheese and cereal, boxes of milk with long shelf life e.g. Parmalat, rice milk, etc.**

PLEASE NO PERISHABLE ITEMS, e.g. loaves of bread or baked goods because they increase the potential for bugs, and they lose their freshness within a short time span.



March 29th is our 5th Sunday fellowship meal immediately following morning worship. Please don’t forget to bring one of your favorite food items to share.

We always have plenty so maybe you can invite a friend, co-worker or your neighbor.
