Restaurant Review:

Smorbrod restaurant is located at 2727 N. Cascade in the old Lincoln school.

They serve Scandinavian style open faced sandwiches in a variety of toppings from pickled herring to chicken curry salad to shrimp to several types of salmon. The sandwiches are presented very artistically. As an example the "Lilehammer" has roast beef and Jarlsberg cheese garnished with a cornichon pickle and ribbons of horseradish spread and beet remoulade. In addition to the sandwiches they also serve meatballs in a creamy dill sauce and sausages. The dessert menu offers a cheese plate, gelatos, s'mores, and a Swedish gooey chocolate cake.

The restaurant boasts a full bar stocked with akvavit and many

vodkas as well as craft beers from the Goats head pub next door. There is plenty of indoor seating as well as a patio to take advantage of a summer breeze.



DELEGATE REPORT 2018 SONS OF NORWAY DISTRICT 6 CONVENTION

The 2018 District 6 Convention was held June 10 - 13,2018, at the Graton Resort in Rohnert Park, CA and was hosted by the District 6 Board of Directors. There were 135 Delegates in attendance representing the 49 Sons of Norway Lodges in the 6 Southwestern States in District 6.

The Convention began with the opening ceremonies, presentation of flags from Norway, Canada and America and traditional march and seating of the District 6 President and Officers.

The Convention is a celebration of Norwegian culture, customs and heritage as well as the business of District 6 and its Recreation Board that represents Camp Norge in Alta, CA.

Educational and cultural seminars were offered as well as Leadership Workshops, Genealogy, Publication, Folk songs, wood carving and other topics. Arts and Crafts Exhibits of Norwegian Folk Art submitted by Lodges were displayed and voted upon for awards

The honorary speaker for the convention was the Norwegian Consul from San Francisco who told us of the important close relationship of Norway and America and how of Sons of Norway was an important part of this connection.

A show of Norwegian Bunads was presented by Delegates with a description of each and the part of Norway that they represented. There were also two silent auctions for items donated by lodge members.

Committee reports were presented about the financial and project activities of District 6 and the Recreation Board. During the formal business of the convention 17 resolutions covering various topics submitted by lodges and the District Board were presented and voted upon. The resolution submitted by Fjellheim Lodge about access of absentee lodges to convention proceedings was approved. This resolution was referred to the District Board for further action.

In the final part of the convention awards to Lodges were presented. Fjellheim Lodge received the award for Lodge of the Year and also a Gold award for Lodge Achievement and a Silver award for Communication. Fjellheim was also recognized for membership growth.

Elections were held for new District 6 officers who were installed at the Awards and Banquet Ceremonies. Nineteen International Delegates were elected to represent District 6 at the 2018 International Convention in August. Fjellheim member Gerald Rowe was elected as one of the International delegates.

It is always an honor and pleasure to represent Fjellheim Lodge and have an opportunity to influence the future of Sons of Norway.


