

Minimalist Photography

What is it... (typically):

- A style or technique that is characterized by extreme sparseness and simplicity
- Less is More
- Minimize amount of components (color, shape, line, texture)
- Leaving interpretation and meaning to viewers
- Small objects in big space
- Leave out unnecessary objects
- Subject does not need to be recognizable (immediately)

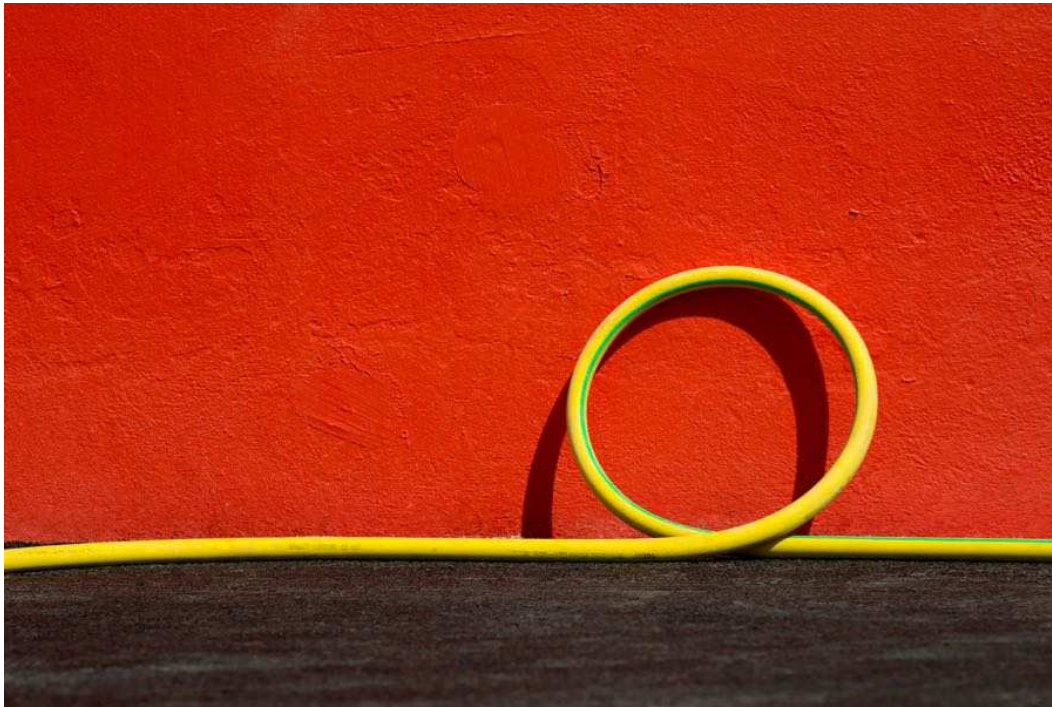
Minimalist Photography

- “Keep it simple” doesn’t mean “keep it boring”
- Minimalist approach requires a lot of creativity
- A well placed subject doesn’t have to be large to have a big impact
- Deciding what to leave out of the frame and create a stronger image can be challenging and often requires a lot of practice until it becomes the way you see
- Make those decisions in camera instead of cropping unwanted distractions in post processing is recommended

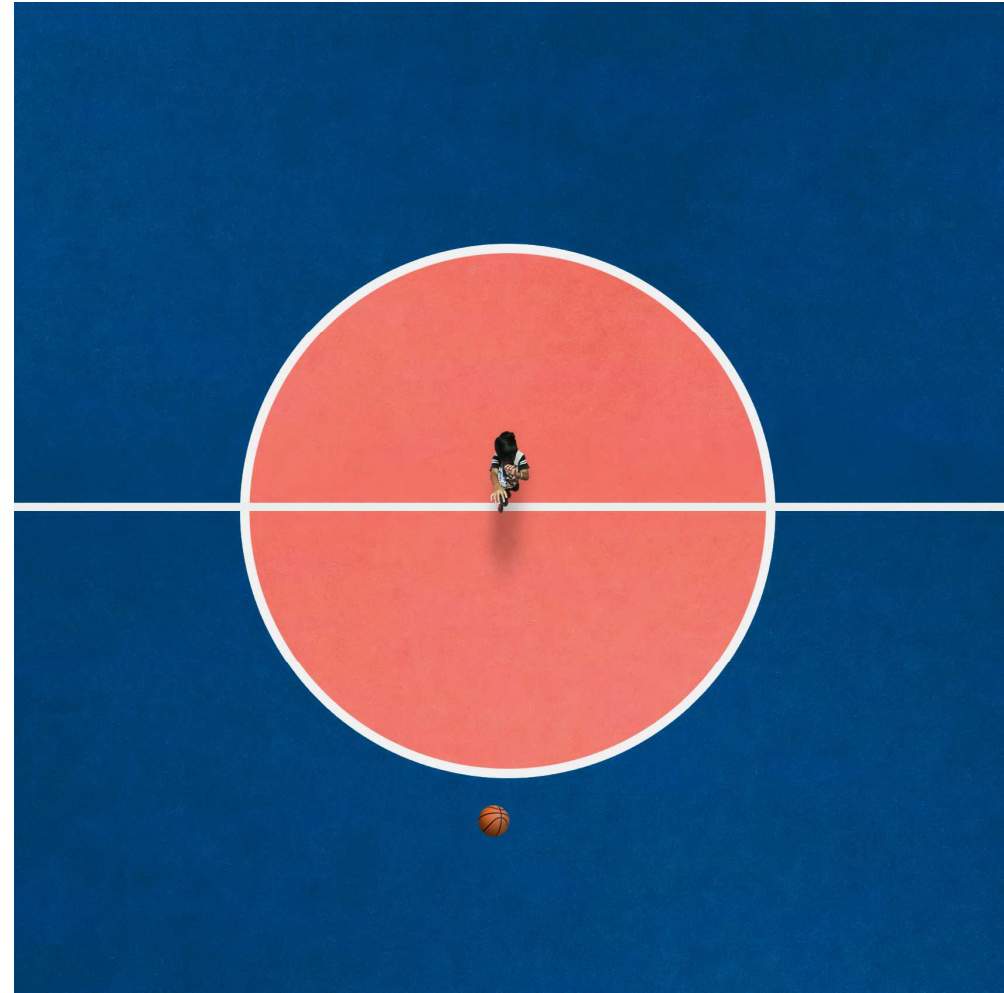
Shallow Depth of Field



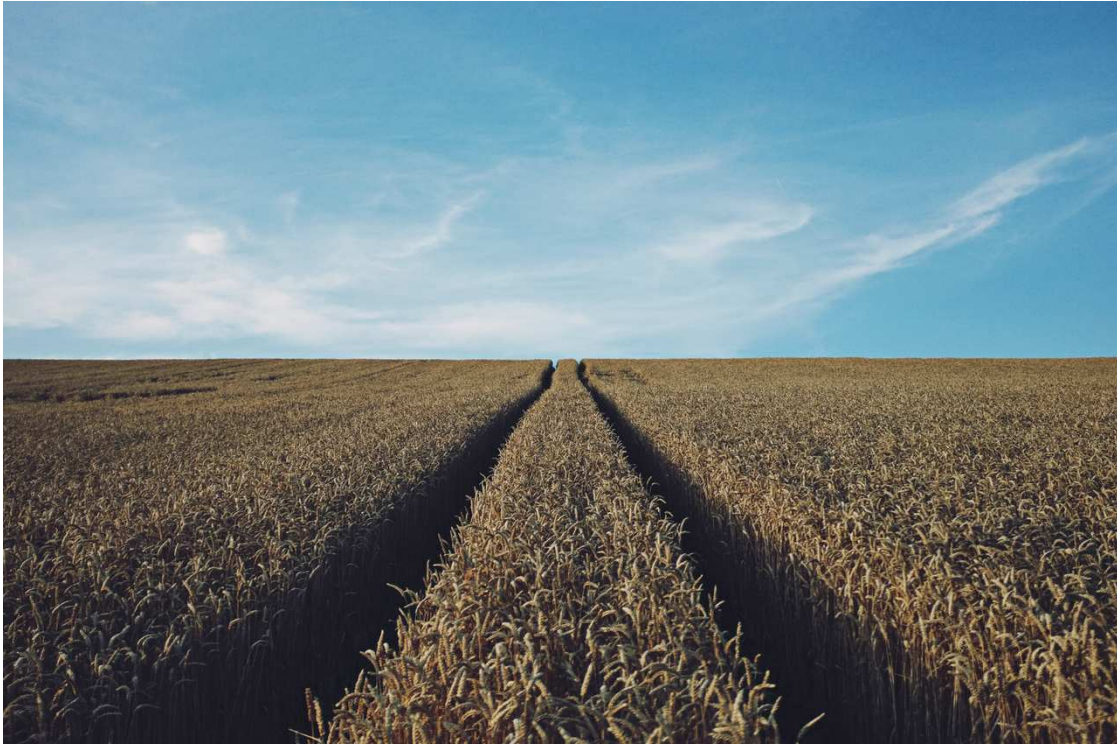
