
RELIGIOUS EDUCATION TEACHERS NEEDED!



THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC **CHURCH**

Good Acts and Evil Acts

A morally good act requires the goodness of the object, of the end, and of the circumstances together. An evil end corrupts the action even if the object is good in itself (such as praying and fasting "in order to be seen by men"). The object of the choice can by itself vitiate an act in its entirety. There are some concrete acts-such as fornication--that it is always wrong to choose, because choosing them entails a disorder of the will, that is, a moral evil. It is therefore an error to judge the morality of human acts by considering only the intention that inspires them or the circumstances (environment, social pressure, duress or emergency, etc.) which supply their context. There are acts which, in and of themselves, independently of circumstances and intentions, are always gravely illicit by reason of their object; such as blasphemy and perjury, murder and adultery. One may not do evil so that good may result from it.

THE QUEENSHIP OF THE **BLESSED VIRGIN MARY** Feast Day August 22

The Feast of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a logical follow-up to the Assumption, and is celebrated on the octave day of that feast. In his 1954 encyclical To the Queen of Heaven, (Ad caeli Regninam) Pope Pius XII pointed out that Mary deserves the title because she is Mother of God, because she is closely associated as the New Eve with Jesus' redemptive work, because of her preeminent perfection, and because of her intercessory power. It goes on to state that Mary is called Queen of Heaven because her son, Jesus Christ, is the king of Israel and heavenly king of the universe; *Ad caeli reginam* states that the main principle on which the royal dignity of Mary rests is her Divine Motherhood. At the First Council of Ephesus in the fifth century, Mary was proclaimed "theotokos", a title rendered in Latin as Mater Dei, in English "Mother of God". The Council insisted on the use of the title to reaffirm the central truth of what occurred in the Incarnation of Jesus Christ and reflected an effort to preserve the teaching of the Church that Jesus was both divine and human, that the two natures were united in His One Person. The sum of this and of equal importance is the fact that we are privileged to know that Mary is our Queen and our ever interceding heavenly mother. What could be more wondrous than that?
