


In my opinion, it is / has been a better show to attend than Aubum, it's just 60 miles away and almost all indoors.







On a bright and early Saturday morning, April 11, 2015, Lars Kneller, his nephew Joshua Sprecher and I headed down the road in Lars' CTS/V. Since the workshop commenced at 9:00 and we had a two hour drive, it was a very early Saturday morning. Also from the Indiana region was our president, Warren Young. Although the workshop was limited to 45 participants, there were 46 CLC members present. By a show of hands approximately one half had never judged at a CLC event before. As you can see from the attached photos, it was a packed room. The workshop was conducted by Bill Anderson who replaced Carl Stag as the chief CLC judge. We knew in advance that it would be a very serious workshop and a lot would be learned. Before the workshop, we were instructed to download and study the current judging manual and the judging committee 2015 report, which can be found on the CLC website under the heading "Judging Tab" on the right hand side of the home page. After the introductions, we were told to pay close attention because at the end of the workshop we would be given a written quiz. From 9:15 to approximately 9:30 was a quick over view of the judging process. Some of the changes to note were that instead of discarding the highest and lowest judging sheet of a four person team, the four team member's scores would be averaged. . Although the previous rule prohibited discussions by team members concerning issues with the car, it was my experience that this rule was not very well followed or enforced. Therefore, the actual affect of the change will be minor. It was also stated that a concerted effort is being made to recruit new judges. To improve judging and to recognize the efforts of those who judge, a system has been proposed to offer standardized, color-coded lapel pins based on accumulation of points for actual judging and obtaining training in judging. The system will start at the bronze level, then silver level, then gold level, then platinum, then senior, and finally master senior.

The second morning session involved discussion of how to use the judging form. Lars Kneller is in the process of preparing a small sheet which has the appropriate deductions for each category. At approximately 15 minutes before lunch, we were handed a quiz to be completed and handed into the chief judge. From noon to 1:00 p.m. we all enjoyed lunch together. After lunch we divided into 11 teams. We spent the rest of the afternoon judging a 1955 Fleetwood 60 special and a 1957 limousine.

Regional judge's training workshop, April 11, 2015

The West of the Lake Region (Chicago area) hosted a regional training workshop in Glen Ellyn, Il., on April 11th. This was the first time the CLC has presented a judge's training workshop in this format. Their goal was to have 25 to 50 members in attendance. 49 members participated including both beginning judges and very experienced judges. Our new Chief Judge, Bill Anderson, is aggressively pursuing training new judges and tweeking the judging format to make it a more distinctly Cadillac design. Several changes are being proposed with implementation in 2017.

Bill Anderson led the seminar and was assisted by Deputy Chief Judge Paul Ayres. Bill had a well prepared Power Point presentation. He covered in detail the current judging system and discussed the direction he wants the judging to take over the next couple of years. At the end of his three hour presentation participants took a written test. Bill is not afraid to challenge our members knowledge.

After a fine lunch at the host Crowne Plaza Hotel, we went up the street to the Heritage Cadillac dealership for hands-on judges training. Heritage Cadillac has been very cooperative with the West of the Lake Region with many of the club meetings held at the dealership.

Three cars were present for our judging teams in their large service department. We divided into twelve teams and went to work judging the cars. One new car, an XTS, was on display so that we could see what condition a new car from the factory looks like. We also had a 1955 Fleetwood which I would estimate as a 78 point car. The other judged car was a 1957 Series 75 limousine. I would estimate that car to be about a 62 point car. We had a wide spectrum of car condition for our training. The 1957 Limousine was a unique vehicle in that it was the Fire Chiefs car during the Mayor Richard Daly administration. It was modified with upgraded electrics for heavy duty use and had a flashing light and siren behind the grill. The owner was present to talk about the special history of the car. It was also used by the city to drive dignitaries around Chicago. Presidents Dwight Eisenhower and John F. Kennedy had ridden in the car.

The National CLC intends to continue with these seminars on a regular basis. I believe that to be a good thing. The extra training will help build a stronger group of judges for our club.

I have been getting several questions asked. I am hoping with your help we can get the word out and get more people involved.

The most common question I have is do they need to drive their vintage Cadillac or LaSalle to attend.

The answer is a resounding, NO!

Although the tour is designed to cater to the vintage cars they are not required.

We welcome all current members and their significant others and guests. Modern cars, or for those that want to fly in and drive a rental car are just as welcomed.

Although the cars are an important part of the event, it is the people that make it all worth having.

I will be surveying participants in the future that would be willing to host anyone that would like to ride along in a vintage Cadillac or LaSalle.

The next question I get is do they need to attend every day? We have broken the days down on the form. Participants are welcome to attend only the days as they see fit. They can come later or leave earlier. They can even skip a day if they would like.

The last question is at what speeds we will be traveling. Based on the National Driving Tour guidelines we will not be using freeways during the tour. I would say the maximum speed limits are in the 45 - 55 mph range. At no point will we be more than 60 +/- miles from the host hotel. We have tried to get as much bang for our buck as we can but have deliberately set a casual and relaxing pace.

Activities to do at Lime Rock Farm:


