Parable of Excuses

"Excuses are like noses; everyone has one." "If you are looking for an excuse, any excuse will do." These are often coined phrases regarding the making of excuses today. An excuse is basically an attempt to avoid making a difficult decision or failing to live up to one's responsibility. Either way, it is easier to make an excuse than take responsibility for yourself.

In the Parable of the Great Supper (Lk. 14:15-24), we find a series of excuses made to avoid the "great supper." In this parable, those invited began to make excuses as to why they could not attend. One purchased a parcel of land and needed to go see about it. Another had purchased five yoke of oxen and wanted to go test them. A third said he had gotten married and could not attend. The validity of these is not even addressed, indicating that they were not "excused absences." The master then turns to others, providing what is seen as a universal invitation to any and all who would come.

When pressed to make spiritual decisions, we find those who often make excuses. There are those who offer excuses for not obeying the gospel. None are valid, and are often attempts to remain in a lifestyle more to one's liking. Sometimes members make excuses for their failure to step up and get involved in various areas of the Lord's work. Some reasons offered can be valid, but, more often than not, they are avoiding something they really don't want to do.

May we be those who refuse to make such excuses when pressed to make a spiritual decision or become involved in some area of the Lord's work. May we make every effort to put the Lord and work in His kingdom at the top of our list of priorities.
