Pastor's Cause to Pause

What do Lutheran's Believe? ... "about baptism"

Holy Communion and Holy Baptism are the only two sacraments of the Lutheran Church. In Holy Baptism, God uses ordinary water and with his Word, does extraordinary things for His people.

How can water do such great things?

Clearly the water does not do it, but the word of God, which is with and alongside the water, and faith, which trusts this word of God in the water. For without the word of God the water is plain water and not a baptism, but with the word of God it is a baptism, that is, a grace-filled water of life and a "bath of the new birth in the Holy Spirit," as St. Paul says to Titus in Chapter 3, "through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. This Spirit he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. The saying is sure." Small Catechism of Martin Luther

We began a practice of bringing water from our home faucets to the font for baptisms at Mt. Hermon. This is a symbolic event where we are reminded that we are baptized into a community of disciples who are to contribute to the development and teaching of disciples. We are also reminded that though it be water from our faucets, it is the Word of God which transforms H₂O into Holy Water! On these special Sundays we both witness the power of God as he claims a new daughter or son, and we also reminded of the promises He made to us at our own baptisms. *God claims us and leads us* to live a life of holy and communal living of all the baptized.

Through this gift of Baptism, we are "brought into forgiveness of sins, redeemed from death and the devil, and given eternal salvation to all who believe it, as the words and promise of God declare." Each Sunday we face the baptismal font, the literal and physical entrance into the church, and we are reminded ourselves of our baptism and its connected to both life and death.

If you attend a funeral where a Funeral Pall is used on the casket, you may notice that the pall replaces the flowers as worship begins. The white cloth is reminiscent of the white garment worn in baptism. The pall is a reminder of our baptismal clothing and a reminder that we are baptized into Christ's death and Christ's resurrection. Our baptism is connected to the life, death, and resurrection of Christ and our own life, death, and resurrection.

Claimed by God, go and live into your baptism.

Team Report/Recommendations:

- 1. Team for Ministry met on Sept. 5 to plan for today's Farming Church Event
- 2. Worship Team: Report received with **Recommendation:**

The Worship and Music Team recommends that we utilize the Palmetto Mastersingers for our Community Epiphany Service at a fee of \$500 to come from the Mt. Hermon Fund for the Arts. **PASSED.**

- 3. Care Team: Fran Bouknight has agreed to chair this Team.
- 4. Outreach Team: Reported that we will have a Trunk or Treat on Halloween evening if we get enough people to volunteer to decorate their cars. We will also have a Fall Festival on Saturday, Nov. 23 for all ages. We are seeking volunteers to read with children at school and/or tutor them for thirty minutes a week.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Farming Church held a congregational event today to share with the congregation the
 information gathered from the listening groups. Each Ministry Team had a display with
 ministry opportunities. Members were encouraged to sign-up to participant in the ministry
 opportunities. Urgency is the next readiness indicator. Terry will send an email with the
 Urgency Webinar link tonight.
- 2. Cemetery Upkeep We are still researching the best way to go. Several options have been discussed. Committee is asking council to give them feedback on which direction we should go.
- 3. Safety Committee Herb Bucknam is in the process of scheduling a date for training.
- 4. Parsonage update Outreach Team has reached out to Lutheran Services Carolina and SC Synod and neither group has a need for the use of our parsonage at this time. Robin Ellisor and others are working to gather the answers to the questions the congregation raised at the last congregational meeting. The Parsonage will be on the agenda for our annual meeting in November.
- 5. Oktoberfest Mt. Tabor and Faith have not finalized plans for this year's event though it is two weeks away. Council decided to not participate in this year's Oktoberfest.

NEW BUSINESS:

- October Council Meeting We will be voting on the 2020 Spending Plan and Council
 Nominations. Council members are encouraged to come to the October meeting with the names
 of four adults and one youth who have agreed to run for council. A list of the ineligible adult
 members and eligible youth members will be distributed to council.
- 2. Will Willimon event October 15 Christian Action Council is sponsoring this event to be held at our church on October 15. Dr. Will Willimon is a professor at Duke Divinity School. The topic is Clergy and Congregations Confronting Racism. The registrations for this event are coming in ahead of schedule.


Outreach Happenings

Our First Initiative in our Farming Church program was to look for ways to serve the community. Outreach Team has talked with community leaders in government, schools and the synod. From those conversations, we have identified several new ministry opportunities that we are excited to share with you.

Reading Buddies – We are looking for adults who can meet with a student in Grades $PreK - 2^{nd}$ grade for 30 minutes once a week to read with that child. This would occur during the school day. Just 30 minutes a week can make a huge difference. Midlands Reading Consortium is



willing to train volunteers free of charge on the best way to help these students advance. Some volunteers may choose to work with two students back-to-back for one hour during the week to reach more students.



Mentoring – If you are interested in becoming an encouraging, supportive, dependable friend for a student, here is your opportunity. Mentors are needed at all age groups. Mentors build trust, listen, encourage and have fun with the students. Most schools have mentors meet with their mentee during lunch.

Cooking Opportunities- There are several ways you can serve if you enjoy cooking. One way is to volunteer to provide a **pot of chili, soup or dessert** for our **Fall Festival, Saturday, Nov. 23** from 11:00am – 1:00pm. The two other cooking needs involve **Palmetto Place**.
