A word from Rev. Jackson:

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ:

Welcome to the season of Advent and the coming of Christmas. There is a lot we can learn about the Christmas narrative as it applies to Mary, Joseph, the Shepherds and the Angels. The Angels had a key role in the arrival of Jesus and the earthly response. First, consider Gabriel's message to Mary "And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you. "But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." (Luke 1:28-30). He then explains how Jesus's birth is going to occur. He concludes with verses: For nothing will be impossible with God? Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her. (Luke 1:37-38). Mary states that she is a servant of the Lord and she is open to his message. Our Advent season would be far more blessed and our faith would grow deeper if we listened to God's message to us and said yes to His plan. Mary said yes to both of these things and her life changed forever....for the better.

Consider Joseph. An angel came to Joseph in a dream and said: "But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins". (Matthew 1:20-21). Joseph obviously listened to the angel and stayed with Mary. As a result his life changed forever as well. God accomplished miracles through him because he removed his fears and said yes to the angel's message.

Then, on Christmas Eve, the shepherds are visited by angels: But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I will cause great joy for all the people." "When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about." "The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told" (Luke 2:10, 15 & 20). The shepherds heard the angel's message, removed their fears, acted upon it and went forth as witnesses of the greatest event in history.

These three visitations all have the common theme of fear being removed, the recipients responding "YES" in faith, and earth shattering blessings occurring when they act upon the message. This is their Christmas message to us: When the Holy Spirit prompts us, may we say yes in faith and act upon what God is calling us to do. May our fears be removed as we listen to the still, small voice within us. Then watch the blessings unfold in our lives when we respond like Joseph, Mary and the shepherds. I believe God has some wonderful blessings to reveal to us in the New Year of 2020. May each of us have a willing spirit and a heart that says "YES" to Jesus's leading us.

I pray that each of you will have a blessed and peaceful Advent and a Christmas filled with the joy of the Lord.




