

Sharing Peace and Thanksgiving ---------- With Pastor Eric

After traveling to New York by airplane last month, I noticed something that stopped me in my tracks. I sat in the cheap seats in the back of the plane – row 25- and realized how long it would take to get off that plane to make my

next flight connection. I sighed and thought that it would take "forever." However, once we landed and parked, I noticed the efficiency of the multitude exiting the plane – perhaps, ten minutes? Could it be that the only place left on the planet where people consistently witness courtesy for strangers is when waiting to exit a plane. We wait for people to exit their row, search out their bag from the overhead bins, and drag them off the plane. You see people entertaining children, collecting forgotten items crammed into seat pockets – and help each other "strangers" in this process! Why is this the case?

Could it be that we have a common goal, a corporate self-interest that somehow overrides our impatient, self-absorbed liberties? Or the threat of being banned from the airlines? What do you think?

I am reminded of a story about a pastor who was hospitalized. The council chairperson came to visit. He said, "Pastor, the council passed a resolution asking God to help you toward a full recovery. The vote was 23 to 18." Ouch! It seems that divisiveness, resentment, and anger abound in so much of our country right now – and around the world as in the Israel-Palestinian conflict for example. Paul admonishes the Romans: "If it be possible, so far as it

depends on you, live peaceably with all." (Romans 12:18). Couldn't all of us resolve to lower our voices, to control our passions, and to be civil with all persons? Can we promise to disagree without being disagreeable. Jesus teaches, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." (Matthew 6:9). We are children of God by baptism into Jesus's death and resurrection. So why not, lean into our calling, our identity, and work towards peace. We have peace with God already as a gift and we can share that peace in other ways in our life – family, friends, neighbors, co-workers, as the nun sings in the musical Sound of Music – "Let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me." Christians have the tools to share in peace, like forgiveness and faith, as well as the Holy Spirit working in and through us. We have love and the fruits of the Spirit growing within us (...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, ²³gentleness, and self-control. Galatians 5:22-23). Like the airplane observation, we have something else – a common humanity. We share the same basic needs and desires common to our species and all of us heading in the same direction which is "off the plane" into a future together on this bright blue-bubble in the universe.

Thanksgiving month is a wonderful time to consider our blessings and the joy we have simply being alive at this moment – together on the "airplane". God created us to be together with partners and friends because together is the only way we make it.

Let us pray. Gracious God, fill our minds with wisdom and our hearts with compassion to live peaceably together. May thanksgiving be in our mouths and love abide in our ways to glorify you for the sake of Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. Amen.




Stewardship Theme for November: You Have Heard It

"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?" —Psalm 22:1

Dear church,

As Lutherans, we are accustomed to holding tension between two truths. Thus the ELCA denounces the egregious acts of Hamas, acts that have led to unspeakable loss of life and hope. At the same time the ELCA denounces the indiscriminate retaliation of Israel against the Palestinian people, both Christian and Muslim.

For the past week we have borne witness to the horrors of the escalating crisis between Israel and Hamas. We also watch a growing humanitarian crisis in Gaza as Israel blocks food, water, fuel and medical supplies and as airstrikes continue to cause unbearable civilian casualties ahead of a just-announced ground assault. We see Israelis and families around the world in the agonizing wait for word about the fate of loved ones killed or taken hostage by Hamas. We are in anguish, grieving and praying for all people who are living in trauma, fear and uncertainty.

Among us are Palestinian Lutherans who are fearful for their families, their communities and their homeland. In our communities we have Jewish and Muslim neighbors, who are also facing the horrors of this crisis and its impact on their loved ones.

It is difficult to find words that suffice in the complexity of this moment, and in the web of relationships that bind us together, as church, with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land and our interreligious partners. Yet God has called us to be a people who stand with others amid suffering.

We must also call a thing a thing. The power exerted against all Palestinian people — through the occupation, the expansion of settlements and the escalating violence — must be called out as a root cause of what we are witnessing. We are committed to our long-standing accompaniment of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land.

The God who liberates us calls us to be a liberating witness. May it be so.

National Adoption Month

November is National Adoption Month, a time to honor families who have opened their hearts and homes to children and teens. This month at LSI, we celebrate the families we support through Foster Care and Adoption and raise awareness for the hundreds of Iowa children needing a safe, healthy home.

Iowa foster families, like the Smiths*, raise the bar by opening their loving households to children and teens in need of a place to call home.

At LSI, we understand the importance of keeping youth in their communities to help maintain connections and stability during times of transition. So, when our staff received a referral for a teenage girl needing foster care placement, they looked inward toward the community.

At the time, homes in the area were either full or not open to accepting teenage placements. Coincidentally, the Smiths were present at a meeting the same night the referral came in. When they heard about Rebecca's* situation, they immediately knew who the child was and wanted to help in any way they could.

The Smiths were already over their licensing capacity, having been granted a variance to accept a sibling group. To be able to bring Rebecca into their home, they would need to be given another variance, which was almost unheard of.

"It was by chance, or the grace of God, that the Smiths were able to accept another child, and give Rebecca a stable placement with a family in her community," said Dawn Luetje, LSI Director of Resource Family Licensing and Support, working in conjunction with Four Oaks Family Connections.

Thanks to the combined support of the Smiths, LSI staff, and the community, Rebecca was placed in the foster home, where she could maintain her daily activities with the teachers, coaches, and friends she was comfortable with. Rebecca continues to thrive in a stable, loving foster home environment and a caring community.
