BERTHA DEVENO Oak View Cottage

I was born to Granville and Grace Douglas on January 30, 1928. My name is Bertha, but everyone calls me Bert. I had one brother and one sister, and I was the oldest. We lived in

the woods close to Litchfield, Maine. Dad would cut wood and logs, often hiring out to do this for others. He would some times take me along to help him, although I think it might not have only been for my help, but to get me out of my grandmother's hair. I was good with the cross cut saw. Dad would cut some trees and send me back into the woods with the horse to get the logs out and haul it to the truck. He and I would take our lunches and be out in the woods for the day.

After high school, on March 14, 1945, I got married to a neighboring farmer named Joe Deveno. I had an Italian husband. When we first got married, I realized very soon that I couldn't cook Italian food well. I went behind the barn and cried. My mother-inlaw taught me how to create the dishes Joe was used to, and eventually, I learned my way around the Italian kitchen.

I was a housewife, and I raised the babies. Joe was a farmer and would milk the cows and then take the milk in a truck to Portland. Joe's parents were sickly so I helped take care of them, too. I would wash the laundry on a washboard and hang them on the line. I did-up the clothes for everybody.

We had to leave Maine because our land was being developed. Joe and I looked through ads in real estate magazines. We thought this ad for a Missouri piece of land sounded good. We came and met with the real estate agent and looked at properties until we found what we were looking for. With four kids, two dogs,



two horses and a canary we left Maine. It took our car, a ton truck, and two u-hauls to get moved. On the way down we stopped in Ohio and had a lunch. When we got back to the car there were canary feathers all over! One of the dogs had thought the canary was a varmint and had killed it. The kids weren't very happy over this tragedy. We had a funeral for the canary before we kept going.

We first lived in Purdy and then we moved to Fayette. We had a dairy farm in Fayette where we would milk 100 cattle in the morning and in the evening. We raised animals like cattle, sheep, horses, and pigs. The children would take them to parades and fairs to show. The kids (Joanne, Mary,

Thomas, and Cathy) graduated high school in Missouri. The girls met Missouri boys and married them. Thomas is working in Texas.

I have seven grandchildren and many great-grandchildren. My family has always loved animals of all kinds. It started with my great-granddad who trained horses for himself and others. Now I have relatives who show horses at the Missouri State Fair and who also provide carriage rides for wedding or other special occasions. My room at Loch Haven is filled with pictures of dogs, cats, and especially horses. I have several different kinds of birds that visit my birdfeeders, and they are a joy.

I have been here at Loch Haven for three years now. I enjoy the activities that they provide, and the staff is very good to me. by Janis Fraley

Freezer Caramel Drizzle Pie

9 inch prepared graham cracker crust
3 tablespoons butter
3.5 oz coconut
1/2 cup chopped pecans
7 oz sweetened condensed milk
4 oz cream cheese, softened
8 oz Cool Whip, thawed
6 oz caramel ice cream topping

Melt butter in skillet. Add coconut and pecans, stirring to coat. Sauté until coconut and pecans are lightly toasted, about 5 minutes. Set aside. In a large mixing bowl, whip together condensed milk and cream cheese

until fluffy. Fold in whipped topping. Spoon 1/4 of cream cheese mixture into graham cracker crust. Drizzle with 1/4 of caramel topping. Repeat layers with remaining cream cheese mixture and caramel. Top pie with coconut and pecan mixture. Freeze overnight. Can easily double.

Layered Cornbread & Turkey Salad



 (6-ounce) package buttermilk cornbread mix
 (12-ounce) bottle Parmesanpeppercorn dressing
 cup mayonnaise
 cup mayonnaise
 cup buttermilk
 (9-ounce) package romaine
 lettuce, shredded

2-1/2 cups chopped smoked turkey (about 3/4 pound) 2 large yellow bell peppers,

chopped

- 2 large tomatoes, seeded and chopped
- 1 red onion, chopped
- 1 cup diced celery (about 3 celery ribs)
- 2 cups (8 ounces) shredded Swiss cheese

10 bacon slices, cooked and crumbled 2 green onions, sliced

Prepare cornbread according to package directions; cool and crumble. Set aside. Stir together dressing, mayonnaise, and buttermilk. Layer half each of crumbled cornbread, shredded lettuce, and next 7 ingredients in a large glass bowl; spoon half of dressing mixture evenly over top. Repeat layers ending with dressing mixture. Cover and chill 8 to 24 hours. Sprinkle top with green onions just before serving.

Summer Linguini

12 oz. linguine

4 tbsp. unsalted butter

1 bunch scallions (or green onions), sliced, greens and whites separated

- 3 c. corn kernels (from about 3 ears)
- 1 tbsp. chopped fresh parsley

4 oz. feta cheese

Cook pasta according to package directions. Reserve 1/2 cup pasta water. Saute scallion whites in 2 tablespoons butter and season with salt and pepper. Cook 3 to 4 minutes. Add corn, tossing to coat, and cook until just tender, 2 to 3 minutes more. Add pasta, ½ cup pasta water, and remaining 2 tablespoons butter to pan and toss to combine. Fold in scallion greens and parsley. Top with feta and parsley.
