A Note from the Rabbi,

December is the time for celebrating Hanukkah, the eight-day festival of lights that begins in the evening of the 25 of Kislev, Saturday night, December 24, and ends in the evening of Sunday, January 1st.

Hanukkah celebrates the military victory of the Maccabees, who rebelled against the Syrian Greeks who wanted the Jews to assimilate to the Greek way of life.

The Syrian Greek empire controlled the Jerusalem Temple. After the victory of the rebels, they rededicated the Temple and lit the sacred lamps. Here is a description from 2 Maccabees: "It is also the festival of the kindling of the fire. For when our ancestors were being taken (into exile), the pious priests of that day took some of the fire on the altar and hid it, so that the place remained unknown to anyone. Many years later, Nehemiah sent the descendants of the priests who had hidden the fire to get it... They could find only muddy water. He ordered them to draw some water and sprinkle the water on the wood and offerings... the sun, which had been clouded over, came out and shone on it, and a great blaze was kindled."

This is the time to enjoy Hanukkah foods such as latkes [fried potato pancakes] and sufganiot [red-jelly stuffed doughnuts]; Hanukkah games with S'vivon [dreidel - a spinning top engraved with the Hebrew letters nun, gimmel, hei and shin, an acronym for "a great miracle happened there"; and of course giving Hanukkah gelt - gifts or money to young children.

Wishing you Chag Urim Same'ach - a very happy festival of lights.

Beth Shalom of Whittier Contingent Hears Speaker from Madagascar



On November 16 some of us braved the freeways to attend a presentation by Elysha Netsarh at Cal State University Northridge. Elysha, a plant biology researcher and teacher from Madagascar, shared her story of the process that led to her formal Orthodox conversion in May 2016 along with 120 members of her community.

Many people living on this island, a former French colony, off the coast of East Africa share an oral tradition of having Jewish roots dating back to Solomon. We've heard stories of the "lost tribes" of Israel, but theirs is

bolstered by a study of Malagasy, their language which contains elements of Ancient Egyptian, Arabic, Syrian, and Hebrew.

Fluent in three languages, Elysha is in the process of preparing a Hebrew-Malagasy prayer book and Chumash. She leads a women's chevruta (partnered) study group on Jewish texts and hopes to establish a Hebrew school for children in the future. After the presentation our Whittier group feasted on deli at Brent's, a real treat for us.

Honoring Elie Wiesel

I wanted to let you know about the United State House of Representatives' recent action to honor the late Elie Wiesel.



At the tender age of 15, Elie Wiesel witnessed the darkest side

of humanity while held in the Nazi death camps of Auschwitz and Buchenwald. Rather than retreating from the world out of fear and despair, Elie became the clarion voice calling all of us to remember and to learn from the Holocaust.

He devoted his life to championing the rights of oppressed minorities around the world because, as he stated, "I must do something with my life. It is too serious to play games with anymore, because in my place, someone else could have been saved."

The impact of Elie Wiesel's life cannot be overstated. He was a beacon calling all of us to remembrance, and calling us to action. For this reason, the House of Representatives, with the support of Edward R. Royce, 39th District of California, passed House Resolution 810. This resolution expresses the sense of the House of Representatives regarding the life and work of Elie Wiesel in promoting human rights, peace, and Holocaust remembrance.

This exceptional man's wisdom is needed now more than ever. The House of Representatives honor his memory by committing to continue his work, to preserve the memory of those who perished in the Holocaust, to protect oppressed minorities that face other genocidal campaigns, and to promote the eternal values of peace, tolerance, and understanding for future generations.
