Genene LeRosen has served as the Executive Vice President at J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College since 2002. In this position, Dr. LeRosen serves as an executive officer providing leadership and direction for academic and professional programs; full and part-time faculty; technology support for teaching, learning, and college operations; student development services; enrollment and management services, learning communities, and outreach and recruitment. Under the direction of the President, Dr. LeRosen has a major responsibility for fostering external relations on behalf of the College.

She has also held positions with Northern Virginia Community College, the Virginia State Council for Higher Education, the College of William and Mary, and Henrico County Public Schools.

Degree in Business Education from Virginia State University, an Ed.D. in Higher Education from The College of William and Mary, and she completed the Management Development Program at Harvard Graduate School of Education.

Dr. LeRosen has participated as a member of several reaffirmation committees for the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, and as a consultant for the ServiceMembers Opportunities Colleges. She has also served on numerous committees such as the Virginia Space Grant Consortium and the Virginia Council on Economic Education. She served as the Chief Staff Member to the VCCS Task Force on Assessing Core Competencies and as resource to the Steering Committee for the Governor's Higher Education Summit, Workforce Development Subcommittee.

Dr. LeRosen has authored and co-authored a number of publications on topics such as Workforce Development, the transfer of academic credit, ways to relieve critical teacher shortages, and preparing a skilled workforce for the 21st century. Her many speeches and presentations have included topics such as "Change, Faculty, and Web-Page Design: A Case Study," "What is a Virginia Community College," "Tech Prep in Virginia," "Gender Equity in Higher Education," and "Classroom Management Training and Discipline," in addition to many other topics.
