FINANCIAL LITERACY SERVICES

Central Plains provides the Opportunity Passport™ Financial Literacy Program to unconnected youth in all areas of Nebraska except Douglas and Sarpy counties. Opportunity Passport™ is a matched savings, assetbuilding program that includes financial literacy education, asset-specific training, and support from a dedicated Coach to ensure participants become financially independent.

Central Plains Coaches facilitate the Keys to Your Financial Future and Your Money Your Goals trainings, while working one-on-one with each youth to achieve economic stability and self-sufficiency. Participants can receive financial matches toward a variety of asset purchases in the following categories:

- Vehicle and Related Expenses
- + Debt Reduction
- + Investments

- + Education
- Housing
- + Entrepreneurship
- + Medical

COACHING SERVICES

Central Plains Center for Services provides a transitional and independent living Coaching program (PALS) across Nebraska designed to provide voluntary support and guidance to unconnected youth and young adults, ages 14-26, who have experiences in one or more of the following:

- + Foster care/child-welfare
- + Juvenile justice
- + Pregnant/parenting
- + Homeless/near homeless
- + Disconnected from positive adult supports
- + At risk of or have experienced human/labor trafficking

PALS Coaches assists these youth and young adults with all the challenges of becoming independent. A Coach will work one-on-one with each of these youth to access their strengths and abilities, as well as assist the youth in identifying their personal vision for becoming a successful, independent adult. The foundation of coaching is the relationship between the coach and the young person. A Coach will assist them in their time of transition and provide on-going support in the following domains:

- + Education
- + Employment
- + Housing & Daily Living
- + Relationships
- + Physical and Mental Health
- Financial Literacy/Budgeting
- + Pregnant and Parenting
- + Permanency/Community Engagement /Leadership

At Central Plains, our commitment is to help every coaching participant achieve their full potential. To do this, we integrate coaching with Nebraska Youth and Families Thrive, taking into account brain development and the effects of trauma. Coaches apply protective and

promotive factors and use a dual-generation approach to positively transform the lives of participants.

TRANSPORTATION SERVICES: Central Plains covers the cost of driver's education classes for eligible youth and young adults with foster care experience.

PARENTING-SPECIFIC SUPPORTS: Central Plains has on staff a certified trainer in Love and Logic™ and Circle of Security™, both of which aim to build strong and healthy attachments between parent and child. We offer these via Zoom or in-person to young adults who are pregnant and/or parenting and participating in Central Plains coaching.

YOUTH HOMELESSNESS DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM (YHDP):

Central Plains through a partnership with the Department of Housing and Urban Development provides coaching and homeless diversion and prevention services as part of YHDP. YHDP utilizes the All Doors Lead Home Coordinated Entry System to provide a coordinated approach to identify individuals and families experiencing or at risk of homelessness and offers them individualized solutions to prevent and end their homelessness.

EDUCATION SERVICES

EDUCATION AND TRAINING VOUCHER (ETV) PROGRAM: Central Plains is committed to improving foster youth's access to post-secondary education and training through the federally funded ETV Program. We do this by providing eligible students with financial scholarships at the post-secondary institution of their choice, paired with support and guidance from an ETV Scholarship Coordinator.

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ETV is an ongoing program that assists qualified students with their post-secondary educational costs and supportive needs for up to five years. ETV is provided through the John H. Chafee Foster Care to Independence Act of 1999.

BACK ON TRACK (BOT): As a part of our Coaching Model, Central Plains provides education and career supportive services to all coaching participants through the evidence-based Back on Track™ (BOT) Model. BOT is being utilized across the state by all Central Plains coaches to ensure youth and young adults have access to educational and career pathways. BOT uses a three-phased approach: Enriched Preparation, Bridging, and First Year Support & Beyond to promote post-secondary and career success. These phases include the following key components:

- + Facilitating connection, integration, and support from secondary and post-secondary education personnel
- Implementing student peer connections and social networks
- + Providing access to financial education and money management strategies
- Assistance in removing barriers to education and employment
