First Generation (1967-1969): <u>1969 Firebird Trans Am Convertible</u> = #2 (Excellent) condition average value: \$1,000,000

Second Generation (1970-1981): <u>1970 Firebird Trans Am 400/370-hp Ram Air IV Coupe</u> = #2 (Excellent) condition average value: \$172,000


Third Generation (1982-1992): <u>1992 Firebird SLP Firehawk Coupe</u> = #2 (Excellent) condition average value: \$61,000

Fourth Generation (1993-2002): <u>1997 Firebird SLP Firehawk 350/330-hp LT4 Coupe</u> = #2 (Excellent) condition average value: \$59,600

Editor notes: Those values/models for the 3rd and 4th Gen Firebirds are rapidly changing. I just watched the 1989 20th Anniversary Trans Am, I formerly owned, cross the auction block in Arizona and it brought a selling bid of over \$64,000. That's substantially more than I sold it for just a few years ago.

The 4th Gen cars are rising quickly too, with several special edition cars commanding an increasing value every day.
