HAIN conducts training programs to enhance capacity development for advocacy, research and training that would hone leaders to become valuable health educators and advocates.

This provides the opportunity for HAIN to propagate its framework in health education which places emphasis on a holistic primary health care approach where socio-economic and political factors are regarded as highly important to attain quality state of health.

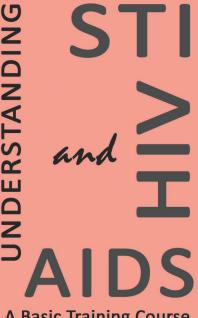



Rationale

It has been almost three decades from the time HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) infection and AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome) have created great alarm in the Philippines. Despite great efforts to prevent its transmission through education, the number of cases continues to grow and this time, younger people are the ones most affected. This will significantly affect the workforce of the country, increase the number of orphans, infect and affect women, and the health care system will be greatly burdened.

Comprehensive education on STI (Sexually Transmitted Infection), HIV and AIDS particularly among young people is yet to be institutionalized. Great responsibility lies in each one of us. STI, HIV and AIDS are not just medical concerns. They play a complex and significant impact on sexuality, moral and ethical issues, stigma and discrimination, relationships and healthy lifestyles.

Understanding STI, HIV and AIDS rather than inculcating fear towards PLHIV (Person Living with HIV) is the only key to prevention. HAIN believes that each one of us should be equipped with objective, accurate and timely information to appropriately respond to STI, HIV and AIDS. Choose life, fight AIDS.

Description

This training covers both biomedical and psychosocial dimensions of STI, HIV and AIDS. It also features sociohistorical and economic implication of the current national and global situation, modes of transmission, how to prevent transmission, and how to access treatment, care and support.

Learning Objective

By the end of the training course, participants will be able to:

- Understand the concept of STI, HIV and AIDS
- Distinguish modes of transmission
- Practice safe sex to prevent transmission
- Identify organizations that provide services on treatment, care and support
- Choose to submit for voluntary counseling and testing
- Provide Communication skills for effective counseling and information activities

Learning Methods

This training course applies teaching learning strategies such as lectures, structured games, group exercises and film showing to stimulate participatory discussion by experts in the field of medicine, social sciences and gender.

Who should attend

The course is intended for employees and employers in private corporations, individuals from academe, professional organizations, local government units, and non-government organizations.

Course fees

Fees are modified according to the training needs of the participants. A minimum of 25 participants is required.
