Spring Cleaning: "Let the Son Shine In!"



When you turn the calendar to March you begin to think SPRING! When spring shows itself we often realize it's *time* to do some deeper cleaning we ignored over the cold winter months, such as the garage, outside of the windows, or some other area of the house that needs a little extra attention.

When we read Psalm 51 we are reading King David praying and asking God for some "deep cleaning." David didn't just mess up in a small way, he committed some pretty horrible sins and this prayer is the "spring cleaning of his heart." {Psalm 51:10: "Create in me a clean heart, O God"}.

After a "season of cold winter" we may have some "hidden dirt" so, let Spring be a reminder of cleaning time. Just as hidden dirt needs to be cleaned away, hidden sin needs to be confessed away. As we read in **Psalm 32:5**: "Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, I will confess my transgressions to the LORD, and you forgave the guilt of my sin."

Another area we may need some spiritual Spring cleaning is to get rid of any unforgiveness or bitterness that could have piled up over a cold winter. Our reminder comes from **Ephesians 4:31-32**: "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

One of the great things about Spring is throwing the windows open for the sunshine and fresh air to flow into the house. Now that spring is here "let the Son Shine In" and the "wind of the Spirit blow fresh upon our heart!" And remember the Good News of **Luke 5:12-13**: "A man said to Jesus, 'Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean' and Jesus' reply was, 'I am willing; be cleansed." Jesus is great at providing spiritual Spring cleaning.
