

Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Pastor's Study Desk Notes

5th Sunday Easter Year B



John 15:1-8

Three weeks ago, I had Crepe Myrtle bushes pushing out new leaves from the stem! Yes, that is early! But my overwhelming concern was that there was still a couple of bushes that I had never gotten around to doing their 'over-winter' trimming back! After they leaf on out fully, at least I will know for sure what branches died over the winter! Today's gospel rubs it in: I am behind on spring gardening! Yet, the more important point is that I 'sync' my time with God's timing anyway. Jesus says that clearly in the gospel, "Apart from me, you can do nothing" (John 15:5). So, the seasons of growth and dormancy are determined by God. Whether I bear fruit or not, is up to my staying connected and in touch with Him-He is the Vine, I am the branch! We recently read a resurrection appearance in the gospel that made the same point. As Peter goes back with the others to fishing (without Christ), in John 21:5, Jesus appears unrecognized on the shore. He gently reprimands them by asking, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" We know the answer. Try to do anything without God. No fish caught. Then Jesus directs them try fishing the other side, and they catch so many they can't pull the net into the boat (Jn 21:6). With Jesus' direction we catch results or bear fruit, but without Him, nothing. As Jesus develops this organic image of vine & branches for us, he identifies Himself as the source of our pruning. To bear the greatest fruit (greatest catch) we must keep attuned to His voice-direction. Jesus says, "You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you" (Jn 15:3). By holding/keeping His word of teaching/instruction, we receive an initial pruning/shaping. Yet, we can still be further pruned to bear even more fruit by His continued speaking further in our hearts. John 15:2 says the vine-dresser continues to prune "so that it bears even more fruit." The pruning never stops – ask anybody good at growing rose bushes how often they go back to pruning?

I think this 'perpetual pruning' detail offers us a lot of spiritual fruit to help us accept and understand how God is always at work in us. Sometimes questions rise in our hearts about why, even if we are doing everything right, that still, bad things happen to us. Even if progressing in sanctity and grace, we just end up facing even more difficult struggles and sufferings. Well, I hear this parable of Jesus about the vine-branches as a partial explanation of what is going on. We are being pruned further so that we bear even more fruit. Suffering for the sake of greater glory/good to come. If we ask a branch if it enjoys being pruned, I suspect it will say no. But the pruning opens the way for more fruit-life to advance (think of flowers in late summer, if you do not pluck the dead heads off the plant will die and go to seed-to keep producing fresh blooms, you have to pluck off dead ones.) So. Maybe we can view our next spiritual challenge/cross as 'pruning'. Yet knowing that God created and planted us, we can be assured that God wants us to thrive and grow strong, and even bloom beautifully. But according to His growing season!

Related to Jesus' teaching here in Jon 15 about the vine and branches, I love his other parable of the gentle gardener in Luke 13:6-9, when Jesus emphasizes the patience of the good grower, to even work with a barren fig tree for another year, gently cultivating it, trying to nudge it back into bearing fruit again. The grower even asks the owner for another whole year to nurse the weak plant back to health! That is Jesus, ever patient and ever tender with His care for us. I love recalling too, that Mary Magdalene mistook and misperceived the resurrected Jesus to be the 'gardener' around the tomb in John 20:15. Something about Jesus' appearance there led Mary to see Him as a gardener (maybe His comfort and ease among fresh, living things!) Yet, I also find Jesus' credentials for cultivating life among everything He touches, from all of his life's actions around the hills, lakes, fields and even deserts in Palestine, to His abundantly green teaching material/parables about seeds, wheat, sowing and fertile soils! With Jesus, comes our growth and fruit! Apart from Him, comes nothing but barrenness! So, we want to keep with Him (familiarize ourselves always with His Life and Words), and be glad & grateful that we are in His Hands- that we are in His garden and tended to by His care!
