Overview: The Santa Barbara Foundation is an 86-year-old community foundation established to enrich the lives of the people of Santa Barbara County through philanthropy. As one of the largest private sources of funding in the county, the Foundation's primary objectives are to build and facilitate philanthropy through donor partnerships; strengthen the social (nonprofit) sector; and identify and strategically address important community needs and opportunities. Guided by compassion for the most vulnerable and those most in need of help, excellence in what it supports and with whom it partners, and integrity with a focus on stewardship and transparency, the Santa Barbara Foundation uses all the tools of philanthropy to help bring about a more vibrant, engaged, and meaningfully connected Santa Barbara County...for all.

Discretionary funding supports the foundation's community leadership and grants to partners working on results-oriented solutions. Currently, key priority areas for discretionary support include:

- ✓ Economic Development (with an emphasis on distressed communities)
