Robert Eugene Fish, 52, of Port Austin and formerly of Grand Blanc, died Sunday, Aug. 26, 2001, at McLaren Regional Medical Center. Robert was born on Sept. 21, 1948, in Flint, and was a 1966 graduate of Grand Blanc High School. He married Constance R. Clark on Feb. 3, 1968, in Flint.
