

Prov 28:1 The wicked flee when no man pursueth: but the righteous are bold as a lion.

Ps 53:5 There were they in great fear, where no fear was: for God hath scattered the bones of him that encampeth against thee: thou hast put them to shame, because God hath despised them.

Lev 26:17 And I will set my face against you, and ye shall be slain before your enemies: they that hate you shall reign over you; and ye shall flee when none pursueth you.

Prov 28:2 For the transgression of a land many are the princes thereof: but by a man of understanding and knowledge the state thereof shall be prolonged. [1kings 16:8-28]

Prov 28:3 A poor man that oppresseth the poor is like a sweeping rain which leaveth no food.

Prov 28:4 They that forsake the law praise the wicked: but such as keep the law contend with them.

Prov 28:5 Evil men understand not judgment: but they that seek the LORD understand all things.

Prov 28:6 Better is the poor that walketh in his uprightness, than he that is perverse in his ways, though he be rich.

Prov 28:7 Whoso keepeth the law is a wise son: but he that is a companion of riotous men shameth his father.

Prov 28:8 He that by usury and unjust gain increaseth his substance, he shall gather it for him that will pity the poor.

Exod 22:25 If thou lend money to any of my people that is poor by thee, thou shalt not be to him as an usurer, neither shalt thou lay upon him usury.

Ps 15:5 He that putteth not out his money to usury, nor taketh reward against the innocent. He that doeth these things shall never be moved.

2Pet 1:10 Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall:

2Cor 13:5 Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves. Know ye not your own selves, how that Jesus Christ is in you, except ye be reprobates?

1John 3:19 And hereby we know that we are of the truth, and shall assure our hearts before him.

Prov 28:9 He that turneth away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer shall be abomination.

Prov 28:10 Whoso causeth the righteous to go astray in an evil way, he shall fall himself into his own pit: but the upright shall have good things in possession.

Ps 7:7 So shall the congregation of the people compass thee about: for their sakes therefore return thou on high.

Ps 57:6 They have prepared a net for my steps; my soul is bowed down: they have digged a pit before me, into the midst whereof they are fallen themselves. Selah.

Job 4:8 Even as I have seen, they that plow iniquity, and sow wickedness, reap the same.

Gal 6:7 Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.

Prov 28:11 The rich man is wise in his own conceit; but the poor that hath understanding searcheth him out.

Prov 28:12 When righteous men do rejoice, there is great glory: but when the wicked rise, a man is hidden.

Eccl 10:5 There is an evil which I have seen under the sun, as an error which proceedeth from the ruler:

Eccl 10:6 Folly is set in great dignity, and the rich sit in low place.

Prov 28:13 He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy.

Job 31:33 If I covered my transgressions as Adam, by hiding mine iniquity in my bosom:

Prov 28:14 Happy is the man that feareth alway: but he that hardeneth his heart shall fall into mischief.

Prov 28:15 As a roaring lion, and a ranging bear; so is a wicked ruler over the poor people.

Num 20:15 How our fathers went down into Egypt, and we have dwelt in Egypt a long time; and the Egyptians vexed us, and our fathers:

Exod 1:14 And they made their lives bitter with hard bondage, in mortar, and in brick, and in all manner of service in the field: all their service, wherein they made them serve, was with rigour.

Matt 2:16 Then Herod, when he saw that he was mocked of the wise men, was exceeding wroth, and sent forth, and slew all the children that were in Bethlehem, and in all the coasts thereof, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had diligently enquired of the wise men.

Prov 28:16 The prince that wanteth understanding is also a great oppressor: but he that hateth covetousness shall prolong his days.

Ecc1 10:16 Woe to thee, O land, when thy king is a child, and thy princes eat in the morning!

Isa 3:3 The captain of fifty, and the honourable man, and the counsellor, and the cunning artificer, and the eloquent orator.

Isa 3:4 And I will give children to be their princes, and babes shall rule over them.

Isa 3:5 And the people shall be oppressed, every one by another, and every one by his neighbour: the child shall behave himself proudly against the ancient, and the base against the honourable.

Isa 3:12 As for my people, children are their oppressors, and women rule over them. O my people, they which lead thee cause thee to err, and destroy the way of thy paths. [Isa. 9:16]

Isa 5:11 Woe unto them that rise up early in the morning, that they may follow strong drink; that continue until night, till wine inflame them!

Prov 23:29 Who hath woe? who hath sorrow? who hath contentions? who hath babbling? who hath wounds without cause? who hath redness of eyes?

Prov 23:30 They that tarry long at the wine; they that go to seek mixed wine.

Ecc1 10:16 Woe to thee, O land, when thy king is a child, and thy princes eat in the morning!

Ecc1 10:17 Blessed art thou, O land, when thy king is the son of nobles, and thy princes eat in due season, for strength, and not for drunkenness!

Prov 31:4 It is not for kings, it is not for kings to drink wine; nor for princes strong drink:

Prov 31:5 Lest they drink, and forget the law, and pervert the judgment of any of the afflicted.

Prov 31:6 Give strong drink unto him that is ready to perish, and wine unto those that be of heavy hearts.

Prov 31:7 Let him drink, and forget his poverty, and remember his misery no more.

Song 7:9 And the roof of thy mouth like the best wine for my beloved, that goeth down sweetly, causing the lips of those that are asleep to speak

Prov 28:17 A man that doeth violence to the blood of any person shall flee to the pit; let no man stay him.

Prov 28:18 Whoso walketh uprightly shall be saved: but he that is perverse in his ways shall fall at once.

Prov 28:19 He that tilleth his land shall have plenty of bread: but he that followeth after vain persons shall have poverty enough.

Prov 28:20 A faithful man shall abound with blessings: but he that maketh haste to be rich shall not be innocent.

1Tim 6:9 But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition.

Prov 28:21 To have respect of persons is not good: for for a piece of bread that man will transgress.

Prov 28:22 He that hasteth to be rich hath an evil eye, and considereth not that poverty shall come upon him.
Prov 23:6 Eat thou not the bread of him that hath an evil eye, neither desire thou his dainty meats:

Prov 28:23 He that rebuketh a man afterwards shall find more favour than he that flattereth with the tongue.

Prov 28:24 Whoso robbeth his father or his mother, and saith, It is no transgression; the same is the companion of a destroyer.

Prov 28:25 He that is of a proud heart stirreth up strife: but he that putteth his trust in the LORD shall be made fat.

Prov 28:26 He that trusteth in his own heart is a fool: but whoso walketh wisely, he shall be delivered.

Prov 28:27 He that giveth unto the poor shall not lack: but he that hideth his eyes shall have many a curse.

Prov 28:28 When the wicked rise, men hide themselves: but when they perish, the righteous increase.
