## **Treasurer's Update**


Money, Finances, Revenue, Income, Expenses - All the things that are on your mind everyday. Where is it going? Where is it coming from? When will it stop going? Believe it or not, as Treasurer of your HOA, I do the same with our funds. As your Treasurer, it is my responsibility, my duty to properly disperse, account for and monitor our HOA monies. As you have freely volunteered your personal funds, the responsibility that I carry is even more important to me. And I can confidently assure you that our funds have been properly managed this past year.

Included in this article is a representation of the major categories that the HOA dues have been spent this year. With only 201 volunteer members, we have collected \$25,791.75 in Dues, Contributions, Advertising and Interest. We have spent \$16,687.01 in Safety, Utilities, Beautification, Communications and Administration. The good news is we have increased our General Fund which

will let us proceed with neighbor improvement projects next year – Street Sign Toppers, Landscaping at the Audelia Entrance and with an increase in membership we may be able to add Dallas Police Dept. patrols of the neighborhood at a cost of \$30 per hour (minimum 4 hour shifts) periodi-

throughout the week. In summary, the Board is not proposing an increase in dues. But we do ask that you renew your membership, contribute any extra you can AND recruit a new HOA member in order that we can successfully complete our plans for 2012.

## C A's Landscape & Yard-of-the-Month Update

On Saturday, September 24, before trash pick up day, some members of the community got together to trim trees on the north side of the Chimney Hill/Abrams entrance. Bob Taeger, Brian Fisher, Steve Mullen, Majors and Barbara Harris, and Stuart Sibley came out to chop tree limbs and haul brush. Thank you to all who participated!

This area would be a great place to have a picnic, and someday we might consider making a trail to the creek.

The next community landscape project was the weekend before October trash pickup. The south Chimney Hill/Abrams entrance and the Trevor entrance were trimmed and cleaned.

I am working on a plan for the Amberley entrance. It will involve some hardscaping as well as soil preparation and planting with native and well-adapted small trees and shrubs. Design plans and cost estimates will be available soon.

'Yard of the Month' criteria-

Some of our neighbors might have wondered how 'Yard of the Month' is awarded. I have given out the awards for the past summer and to my surprise, neatness counts. By that I mean general tidiness; not necessarily over trimmed shrubs and perfect lawns, but an air of being well kept. An attractive design that leads the eve to the front door, unusual plants used in imaginative ways, natives and well adapted plants are things I notice in neighborhood yards.

The neighborhood is toured a day or two before the first of the month. If you have noticed a front yard you really like, con-

tact me, and I will be sure to check it out.

In the past, we have given awards in June, July and August. In 2012, the schedule will be an April award when we see spring bulbs and flowering trees, a June/July award focusing on design and bedding plants, and an October award

There will also be the Holiday decoration awards given the second week of December for some of the over-the-top, elegant and fun lighting displays. CA Hiscock
