SHORT COURSE

Introduction to Ecological Risk Assessment

Charles A. Menzie, Ph.D., Principal Scientist, Exponent Michael Kierski, Ph.D., Managing Scientist, Exponent

This course will cover the basics of ecological risk assessment of contaminants in the environment emphasizing the guidelines developed by EPA to perform an ecological risk assessment. Topics will include a brief history of the development of the practice of ecological risk assessment, the basics concepts of environmental toxicology and chemistry important to assessing ecological risks of contaminants, and the ecological framework used to perform an ecological risk assessment. The course instructors will use real-world case studies based on their own work experience to demonstrate how ecological risk assessments are performed. Case studies will include both examples of the ecological risk assessment performed for aquatic and terrestrial ecosystems. Both Charles and Michael have over 30 years of experience performing ecological risk assessments for a variety of chemical stressors in both aquatic and terrestrial ecosystems.

Landscape Scale Cold-Water Restoration
