Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

4What is church membership? This question is one that is asked often, but not often given much thought. There is more behind the question than can be covered in a short newsletter article, and I encourage you to think about a few points with me this month.

First, I encourage you to pray with me these words of Psalm 103:

- 1 Bless the LORD, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name!
- 2 Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits,
- 3 who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases,
- 4 who redeems your life from the pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy,
- 5 who satisfies you with good so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.
- 6 The LORD works righteousness and justice for all who are oppressed.
- 7 He made known his ways to Moses, his acts to the people of Israel.
- 8 The LORD is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.
- 9 He will not always chide, nor will he keep his anger forever.
- 10 He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities.
- 11 For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him;
- 12 as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us.
- 13 As a father shows compassion to his children, so the LORD shows compassion to those who fear him.

We live in a time where "membership" is used for almost everything. We are members of schools and sports clubs. We are members social organizations and charity efforts. We are members of grocery stores and gas stations. What does membership mean in these organizations? Often it involves money and time. If you give enough money, you get to keep your membership. The more money you give, the more perks you receive through these various memberships?

This is not the way the church must operate. To be a member of the body of Christ, to be a member of Christ's church does not rely on your money. Your money does not get you more perks within His church. I often wonder if we should be using a different word than member in the church to describe what is the reality belonging to His church; but then I am reminded, "You are the body of Christ and individually members of it." (1 Corinthians 12:27) Likewise, "For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, 5 so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. 6 Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; 7 if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; 8 the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness." (Romans 12:4-8)

For this month, I also encourage you to pray through, ponder, and treasure in your hearts these verses from God's Holy Word concerning several topics over church membership:

Pastor's Responsibility to God

"And he said to them, "Go into all the world and **proclaim the gospel** to the whole creation. [16] Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned." (Mark 16:15-16)

"But you, dress yourself for work; arise, and **say to them everything that I command you**. Do not be dismayed by them, lest I dismay you before them." (Jeremiah 1:17)

"Thus says the Lord: Stand in the court of the Lord's house, and **speak** to all the cities of Judah that come to worship in the house of the Lord **all the words that I command you to speak** to them; **do not hold back a word**. [3] It may be they will listen, and every one turn from his evil way, that I may relent of the disaster that I intend to do to them because of their evil deeds." (Jeremiah 26:2-3)

"Moreover, he said to me, "Son of man, all my words that I shall speak to you receive in your heart, and hear with your ears. And go to the exiles, to your people, and speak to them and say to them, 'Thus says the Lord God,' whether they hear or refuse to hear." (Ezek. 3:10-11)

"Keep a close watch on yourself and on the teaching. Persist in this, for by so doing you will save both yourself and your hearers." (1 Tim. 4:16)

"Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; **reprove**, **rebuke**, and **exhort**, with complete patience and teaching." (2 Tim. 4:2)

"Shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly; [3] not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock. [4] And when the chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory. (1 Peter 5:2-4)

What does God say to you?

"For as in **one body** we have **many members**, and the members do not all have the same function, [5] so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually **members one of another**." (Romans 12:4-5)

"And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, **not neglecting to meet together**, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the day drawing near." (Hebrew 10:24-25)

"Take and **eat**; this is my body...**drink** it all of you...for the forgiveness of sins." (Matthew 26:26-28)

"Faith comes from **hearing**, and hearing through the word of Christ." (Romans 10:17)

"Magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt his name **together**!" (Psalm 34:3)

"And they **devoted** themselves to the apostles' **teaching** and **fellowship**, to the **breaking of bread** and the **prayers**." (Acts 2:42)

"Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. **Do** what it says." (James 1:22)

"Whoever acknowledges me before men, I will also **acknowledge** before my Father in heaven. But whoever disowns (denies) me before men, I will **disown** (deny) him before my Father in heaven." (Matthew 10:32)

"If we say we have fellowship with Him (Jesus) and yet walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth." (1 John 1:6)

"Whoever says 'I know him' (Jesus) but does not keep his commandments is a liar, and the truth is not in him," (1 John 2:4)

"So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is **sin**." (James 4:17)

"Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but **living as servants of God**. (1 Peter 2:16)

"What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, and yet **lose or forfeit** his very self (soul)?" (Luke 9:25)

"If we **deliberately keep on sinning** after we have received the knowledge of the truth, no sacrifice for sins is left, but only a **fearful expectation of judgment** and of raging fire that will consume the enemies of God." (Hebrews 10:26-27)

"The Lord will **judge** his people. It is a dreadful thing to fall into the hands of the living God." (Hebrews 10:31)

What are your promises to God?

Your Baptism

Do you renounce the devil? Yes, I renounce him.

Do you renounce all his works? Yes, I renounce them.

Do you renounce all his ways? Yes, I renounce them.

Your Confirmation

Do you acknowledge the gifts that God gave you in your Baptism? Yes, I do.

Do you intend to hear the Word of God and receive the Lord's Supper faithfully? *I do, by the grace of God.*

Do you intend to <u>live</u> according to the Word of God, and in faith, word, and deed to remain true to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, even to death? *I do, by the Grace of God.*Do you intend to continue <u>steadfast</u> in this confession and Church and to suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it? *I do, by the grace of God.*

Who is a member of Immanuel?

Immanuel Constitution - Anyone may become and **remain** a communicant member of this congregation who:

- a) Has been **baptized** in the name of the Triune God and who are under the spiritual care of the pastor of this congregation.
- b) **Accepts** the confessional basis of this congregation and is **familiar** with the teachings of the small catechism, and is not a member of an organization who principles and conduct conflict with the Word of God;
- Conforms entire life to the rule of God's Word and to that end makes diligent use of the means of grace, exercises faithful stewardship of God's gifts, and gives and receives fraternal admonition as the need for such admonition becomes apparent which means;
 - i. **Leads** a Christian life and **abstains** from manifest works of the flesh (Matt. 5-7, Gal. 5:19-23)
 - ii. Is willing to promote the work of the church by **prayer**, **personal** service, and **financial support**;
 - iii. Is willing to **submit** to the regulations, government, and discipline of this congregation, when such are in accord with the Word of God (Matt. 18:15-17)

All parents of this congregation are to make the **fullest** possible use of the Christian educational agencies provided, for both **themselves** and their **children**.

All voters shall faithfully attend meetings of this congregation.

Responsibility as Parents

"Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it." (Proverbs 22:6)

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. **You shall teach them diligently to your children**." (Deut. 6:5-7)

"Fathers, **do not exasperate your children**; instead bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord." (Ephesians 6:4)

What are God's promises to you?

"For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is <u>eternal life</u> in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 6:23)

"If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. [9] If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to **forgive** us our sins and to **cleanse** us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:8-9)

"If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be **saved**. [10] For with the heart one believes and is **justified**, and with the mouth one confesses and is **saved**." (Romans 10:9-10)

"Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you <u>rest</u>. [29] Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. [30] For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30)

"Fear not, for I have <u>redeemed</u> you; I have <u>called</u> you by name, <u>you are mine</u>." (Isaiah 43:1)

"Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he <u>live</u>, [26] and everyone who lives and believes in me shall <u>never die</u>. <u>Do you believe this</u>?" (John 11:25-26)

In Conclusion

Member is a good word, and to think of it biblically is to think of a member in terms of a body. A part of the body cannot live healthy or even survive on its own. It needs the body. When a brother or sister is absent from the Divine Service, it could be a matter of sickness, work, or vacation that has kept them away. It is not good that one is alone, and the body of Christ is a gift given for the help and support of faith. As your pastor, it is my duty and privilege to care about, and care for all members of Immanuel. You are precious to Jesus (Matthew 18:12; Luke 6:31-32) and precious to your church and pastor. Let us sing together:



- The servants Thou hast called And to Thy Church art giving Preserve in doctrine pure And holiness of living. Thy Spirit fill their hearts, Endue their tongues with pow'r; What they should boldly speak, Oh, give them in that hour!
- 6 Yea, bless Thy Word alway,
 Our souls forever feeding;
 And may we never lack
 A faithful shepherd's leading!
 Seek Thou the wand'ring sheep,
 Bind up the sore opprest,
 Lift up the fallen ones,
 And grant the weary rest.
- 7 Bring those into Thy fold Who still to Thee are strangers; Guard those who are within Against offense and dangers. Press onward with Thy Word Till pastor and his fold Through faith in Thee, O Christ, Thy glory shall behold.

THANK YOU for your donation of 6.8 pounds to Mid-Iowa Community Action, Inc. (MICA) Poweshiek County Emergency Food Pantry during the month of June, 2022. We were able to provide food and other necessities to 186 households/514 individuals. This is an increase of 92 households over last month! We distributed 9,000 pounds of food in these food boxes! Others with food insecurity come in to obtain items in the lobby: bakery items and produce. In all, we had 240 visits. THANK YOU for continuing to support the MICA food pantry here in Grinnell!

We have GREAT news! The shopping pantry that had been used by so many of our clients before COVID is now open for business again! Starting on July 5, clients may browse the food pantry and select from among many categories. Staff will be available for assistance.

Over the last few months, we ran information about what is needed to keep our shelves stocked. We have found that some of our staples we purchase are being received in smaller qualities, so your donations are really important. Some of the basic food items that really help are boxes of mac and cheese, cans of soup, canned fruit and/or fresh fruit, canned and/or fresh vegetables, canned meat, frozen meat, and skillet meals. Again, thank you for all the donations that you share each month. If you have any questions, please call us at 236-3923, ext. 322.

The Ceremony of the Offertory

Have you ever noticed the subtle ceremony involved in receiving the offerings during the Divine Service? After all the offerings have been collected, they are brought forward and given to the pastor or one of his assistants. The pastor then turns toward the altar, and as he slightly bows his head, the collection plates with the offerings in them are raised slightly to the Lord and then placed either on the altar or a table for the offerings. Why do we do have this ceremony? And what does it teach us? For that is what ceremony does; it teaches, as the Augsburg Confession tells us, what we need to know about Christ (AC XXIV, 1–3).

Originally, this ceremony included more than simply bringing forward what was collected in the offering plates. The elements for the Holy Communion—the bread and the wine—were brought forward along with the offering plates. As the offering plates and the elements were lifted toward the Lord, and placed upon the altar, the elements would be put in the center and the altar, now made a table, would be set for the Lord's Supper.

These gifts brought to the altar came from the sweat of the people's brow. It is the bread and wine, the fruits of the peoples' labor in this fallen world. After six days of labor and toil, the people would bring a generous proportion for the Lord's work. It was set upon the altar and offered to the Lord for Him to take up and press into His service for His gracious work in and among them.

For what they offered to the Lord from the sweat of their brow, the bread of anxious toil, came back to them as the bread of life, the bread come down from heaven that whoever eats this bread and drinks this cup would receive life through the forgiveness of their sins.

This is not unlike what the Lord did for His people in the Old Testament:

You shall tithe all the yield of your seed that comes from the field year by year. And before the Lord your God, in the place that he will choose, to make his name dwell there, you shall eat the tithe of your grain, of your wine, and of your oil, and the first-born of your herd and flock, that you may learn to fear the Lord your God always. And if the way is too long for you, so that you are not able to carry the tithe, when the Lord your God blesses you, because the place is too far from you, which the Lord your God chooses, to set his name there, then you shall turn it into money and bind up the money in your hand and go to the place that the Lord your God chooses and spend the money for whatever you desire—oxen or sheep or wine or strong drink, whatever your appetite craves. And you shall eat there before the Lord your God and rejoice, you and your household.

What a blessing! God provides for us in all things. He provides bread from the sweat of our brows, and He receives this from us in the first fruits offerings we give to Him in thanksgiving and praise. He receives and turns it into spiritual bread, heavenly bread, the bread of eternal life and gives it back to us so that we might have joy. So, the next time you are in the Divine Service, watch this ceremony in wonder, that the Lord gives back to us, what we have given to Him so that we may rejoice in the salvation He has won upon the cross and gives to us in His supper.

Business as usual – Nothing new to report. Continued work on the membership list.

Treasurer's Report: Chris Christinson

 Written reports attached. All bills have been paid and the current balances are reflected.

Board of Trustees: Kevin Schultz/Diane Schultz

- The carpeting is installed and church service will be held in the sanctuary beginning June 19th.
- The building insurance through Lutheran Brotherhood is increasing 60%. Diane and Kevin contacted Grinnell Mutual requesting an estimate for building insurance comparable to the current policy. There will be a few changes in the policy as to limit of exposure and an inspection requirement.
- Steve motioned to approve moving the building insurance from Lutheran Brother-hood to Grinnell Mutual Insurance Company with a yearly cost of \$6638 and saving \$2558 from the current policy. Sherry 2nd Motion carried. Final approval is required by Immanuel members and will be presented at the July 17th Voter's meeting.
