Matt 17:1-9



"Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone. As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.."

the veil that is lifted so briefly upon his unseen
glory drops again; the tale to remain untold
until his rising from the dead – when the light we've begun to
know makes its home in the church,
to reveal his glory in us, and transfigured will be me and you.

Eucharistic Renewal Meditation

"One way of caring for and growing in a fruitful understanding of the symbols of the Liturgy is certainly the ars celebrandi, the art of celebrating (presiding with attention & craft). This expression also is subject to different interpretations. Its sense becomes clear if we refer to the theological sense of the Liturgy described in Sacrosanctum Concilium n. 7, to which I have already referred several times. The ars celebrandi cannot be reduced to only a rubrical mechanism, much less should it be thought of as imaginative — sometimes wild — creativity without rules. The rite is in itself a norm, and the norm is never an end in itself, but it is always at the service of a higher reality that it means to protect." (Desiderio #48)

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

2nd Sunday Lent Year A

Matthew 17:1-9

Mountaintop Experiences are revelatory, opening us to things that we may not be aware of down in the valley! Jesus takes Peter, James and John up the mount for a *summit* with Moses & Elijah. Why Peter, James & John? Because they are 'leadership' picks for Jesus. He wants them to lead like Him. He calls them closer to Himself, to teach them how to be exemplary guides to the other nine apostles. He is showing this 'inner circle' how to lead and serve in His Name. St. Paul recognizes this, too, as he refers to these three as 'pillars among the apostles' in Galatians 2:9. A couple of times in His ministry, Jesus will uniquely bring along Peter, James and John alone with him for some event. In Mark 5:37, Jesus only takes Peter James and John into Jairus' house to miraculously heal his daughter. In the garden of Gethsemane, it will only be Peter, James and John who are invited to enter more deeply into the garden grove, to pray with Jesus (Matthew 26:37). And keep in mind that Peter, James and John are the first apostles called by Jesus (Matthew 4:18-22). They seem to constitute an inner group with Jesus, to serve as His leadership core among the larger group of apostles. And their unique place is not all positive. Jesus will also uniquely reprimand these three apostles, being severe with them about what to avoid in leadership. When Peter wants to rewrite God's will, taking the cross out of discipleship (Matt 16:22-23) and when James and John let power go to their heads by asking for 'glory seats' (Matt 20:21-27), Jesus especially scolds them. These three apostles, have to stay after class and be given advanced lessons in Christ's leadership style. But this extra time (for both camaraderie and correction) is Jesus' further investment in them and expresses His intention to have them guide the other nine apostles (& all of His church). They are to be servant leaders like Him!

Haven't we all had 'peak experiences'? High times that are stimulating boosts to motivate us and carry us along when things are not going so smoothly. I view the Transfiguration as a type of 'pep-rally' for the apostles. It offers a glimpse of the greatest good that can be or that is coming soon. It is like a 'vision-quest' meant to strengthen their endurance when they are tempted to give up. Similar to Dr Martin Luther King's last speech "I've been to the mountaintop", the transfiguration scene of Jesus being glorified beside the great Moses and Elijah is meant to instill hope and strength into Peter, James and John to persevere in His name, no matter what adversities they will face. Whether in glorying or grunting, they will be in good company with the triumphant Jesus. Yet, Jesus realistically reminds them that such glory comes only through the grueling grind of climbing mountains, which is where Moses and Elijah come in to the picture. They are both associated with God experiences on mountains (& 40 day stays on mountains). In Exodus 33:18-23, God tells Moses to stand in a cleft of rock on Mt. Sinai, and God shows him His glory. In 1 Kings 19:11-12, Elijah also ascends a mountain — Mt. Horeb (another name for Mt. Sinai) to experience the glory of God in the still, small whisper of wind. Moses and Elijah, like all leaders, similarly needed to remember the 'highs' of grace, because leadership brought them plenty of afflictions and adversity, too. In Numbers 11:11, we hear of Moses' complaints to God and in 1 Kings 19:4 Elijah laments his leadership position (Elijah even says, "Take me, I'm done!"). But, their 'visions' of God are meant to carry them through these tormenting ordeals of management. Moses and Elijah do persevere through the grace of their mountaintop experiences.

The poet William Blake wrote in his Notebooks, "Great things are done when men and mountains meet; this is not done by jostling in the street." So, by Jesus bringing Peter, James and John along, He was preparing them for greater things to come for them, too. Jesus says as much in John 14:12 when he tells his faithful followers, "whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these." The mountain top vision spurs them on when they may have questions (doubts) or feel discouragement in their ministries. I like how Jesus provides other little 'mountain experiences' (little victories) to them along the Way too. I see such a boost to the confidence of Peter/James/John, when Luke 9:10 describes the return of the apostles from mission, and they 'explained to Jesus what they had done'. I see them beaming as they tell Jesus of the wonders they performed in His Name. Or another such small victory-shot of confidence comes to Peter as he first began to 'walk on water' (Matthew 14:29). These 'peak experiences' pick up and strengthen the apostles (and us) to keep faith and persevere whenever 'cross-winds' or obstacles enter their ministry paths. We can count on such challenges too, as we take up our Lenten practices and prayers for our spiritual transformation. We want to keep fresh in our minds, the glorious vision of Jesus on the Mountain, especially through any experiences of dark valleys this Lent. Peace, Fr Brian
