Dear Pastor Jamie and Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings from Bali, Indonesia...

It's been more than 3 weeks now that I have gone back from the United States, having spent time with you at the First Presbyterian Church in Mineral Ridge. It has been one of the highlights in my life...being in a warm loving Christian community of faith. Being hosted by a wonderful family and congregation. Witnessing your love being brought to the community by your gifts of food, banquet, voluntary works and hosting snacks for social events. And also myself being invited to lunch and dinner, enjoying a good meal and a wonderful conversation of getting acquainted with each other, strengthening and encouraging one another, or having a nice time together. It gave me a realization that food is very important, that it does bring people together.

Yesterday the Association of Women with Theological Education, of which I am chair for the Bali Chapter, organized a seminar campaign to stop abuse to women and children. I talked to an ex police officer who is now an activist for ministry to abused women and children. I asked what program would be beneficial for them and she replied that now is the time for action, no need for more seminars. So I came with the idea of having a social banquet for prostitutes, HIV AIDS patients and drug users in the future, to be hosted by churches in turns, and pastors and counselors as hostesses to sit side by side with them. I hope to realize it in 2018. And this idea came from having experienced your hospitality.

Pastor Jamie has asked me about the situation in Bali with the mountain eruption. Mount Agung had several erratic eruptions in the last 2 weeks, one guite a big one two days ago with volcanic dust and cold lava which caused the airport to be closed for one day. But it has opened again. The gift of clothes by the sewing club will be given at the inter-denomination Christmas celebration on the 29th of December, as a symbol of the gifts for the refugees. At the moment there are about 50,000 refugees spread around Bali. Please support us in your prayer that the Mount Agung situation will soon end without casualties. You all have a special place in my heart and are in my daily prayers.

#### **Back Pain Relief**

At some point in their lives four out of five people will have back pain, the leading cause of disability among adults ages 45 and younger. More than 26 million Americans ages 20 to 64 report frequent back pain, which may lead to poor mental and physical health. Here are ten tips to prevent or ease back pain:

- 1. Go hot—try heating pads, heat packs and warm baths for acute pain.
- 2. Quit smoking—nicotine impedes blood flow to the back. So drop the habit to prevent or relieve pain.
- 3. Be mindful—practice meditation to reduce stress and ease chronic back pain.
- 4. Walk it off—even when in pain take a short walk every hour to maintain your back
- 5. Call your doctor if you have numbness, tingling or pain that persists despite rest.
- 6. Lose weight—shed extra pounds to take the pressure off your back.
- 7. Do the twist—practice yoga to stretch and strengthen back muscles.
- 8. Be supportive when seated or driving—place a lumbar roll or rolled towel in the hollow of your back.
- Join a support group—don't endure chronic back pain alone. Seek out local or online support groups.
- 10. Fight back—eat foods that fight pain causing inflammation, like salmon, nuts, berries, and olive oil. Exercise and strengthen your core muscles, be patient, back pain is a very common problem and can get better with time, being active will help ward off chronic pain.
