I even showed up at my own retirement party. But here I am, right back where I started 45 years ago -- a full time pastor. But I am not unhappy about this. Instead, I am thrilled. I have always loved being a pastor. And I want you to know that I especially love being the pastor at My-AledoUMC. Already I have encountered and participated in new and exciting ways of doing ministry and I have been introduced to imaginative and meaningful ways of experiencing worship which I find to be energetic and spirit-filled. As we are about to begin a new year perhaps we might consider the exciting possibility of retryment. Retirement is not a bad thing, of course. In fact, it is good to put some things to rest and leave them behind -- old grudges, past disappointments, resentments, to name only a few. Retryment, though, is a proactive way of moving ahead. The Biblical word for retryment is repentance, which literally means to turn around. It means more than just leaving something behind. It means trying something new and moving forward. The good news, of course, is that it is never too late to do this -- for anybody. The Bible says so!

Friends, I am looking forward to enjoying my retryment with you these next several months. Good things are going to happen.

One more thing. Patti and I want to thank you all for your gifts and kind expressions of love this Christmas. It means a great deal to us.

## I HAVE A DREAM

On Monday, January 22th, we celebrate the anniversary of the birth of slain civil rights leader Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. For our kids, it's a day off from school. My experience is that for many of them, that's <u>all</u> it is. Why DO we celebrate this man's birthday?

Although he is often labeled as simply an advocate of African-American rights, Dr. King's message truly transcended any notion of merely being a spokesman for a particular group. His was NOT simply a message of race and color; his was a message of hope- grounded in strong Biblical principles. When he delivered what was arguably his most famous speech, he said, "I have a dream." His dream was NOT that we would let ethnicity separate us. His dream was NOT that people of a particular skin color would strike out against those of another color. His dream was NOT that children would learn to hate others because of their physical appearance. His dream was that ALL people could live together in peace and harmony, regardless of the color of their skin. When that glorious day happened, he said, we would be able to quote the old spiritual and exclaim, "Free at last. Free at last. Thank God Almighty, we are free at last!"

We are all unique and we are all different. That's NOT our weakness- it's our strength! Our diversity makes us strong. We are all children of God- made in His image. This month, take a moment and reflect on Dr. King. Tell your kids or grandkids about him. My prayer is his prayer- that one day we will live in a world where people aren't judged by the color of their skin, but the content of their heart.






Our Caring Hearts freezer, located by the elevator doors in the basement, has a variety of soups, casseroles, fruit, and desserts.
