New procedure to add to the Post By-Laws was agreed to by the membership at the June 20, 2024 meeting. The Commander tabled this for 90 days giving the membership time to read and ask questions. A vote by the membership will take place at the Post monthly meeting on October 17, 2024 to approve.

RESOLUTION 1-2024

Permanent Changes to the Post By-laws

- 1. Any motion to amend the By-Laws of Nittany American Legion Post 245, in order to be considered, must be properly seconded, and must include a formal resolution outlining the updates or purposed changes.
- 2. Once the motion is made and seconded, the Post Commander shall shelve the motion for no less than 90 days for Post membership review. After which a vote shall be scheduled for either a special meeting or regularly scheduled monthly meeting.
- 3. In order for the resolution to be adopted, a three-fourths majority of attending and absentee ballot votes must be in the affirmative.
- 4. If the resolution fails to gather a three-fourths majority, the motion shall be shelved permanently by the Commander.

Constitution Day Roundtables Highlight Immigration Questions

Most Americans agree that the nation's immigration policy needs an overhaul, but perceptions differ about what kinds of solutions the country needs. The public is cordially invited to the Making Our Voices Heard Roundtables, on Saturday, Sept. 14 from 11 am to 1:30 pm., on the American Legion patio. The roundtables lead the annual Constitution Day Centre Celebration.

The Making Our Voices Heard Roundtables will bring together residents to discuss key questions such as: Who do we welcome? How do we balance fairness and security? How do we strengthen our common bonds -- and America?

"As citizens, it is our job to ignore the noise and get to work at finding our common ground. If the American idea is going to survive, we need to start sitting down, intentionally, with people from different backgrounds and work to understand why they see the world differently. Only then will we have the basis for finding the common ground on which to move the country forward," says Constitution Day Centre President David Hutchinson.

Led by moderators, local residents will listen and share their views in groups. At the conclusion, each group will give a short report. A summary will be shared in local media and with local legislators to help shape public policy.

There also will be a presentation of the Madison Award for Civility in the Community. This award celebrates individuals or groups who demonstrate leadership and civility.

BSA Troop 245 Corner

The American Legion BSA Troop 245 has several of our Eagle Scouts leaving the nest, as they have turned 18. They are all founding members of the troop, have collectively performed thousands of hours of community service, are all members of the Order of the Arrow (BSA Camping Honor Society), spent hundreds of nights camping, and all provided significant contributions towards the success of BSA Troop 245. We want to thank them for their service to the troop and wish them the very best success!

Travis Bechtel earned his Eagle Scout rank in November 2023. As his Eagle Project he designed and coordinated the construction of 60 squirrel boxes for the non-profit animal rehab organization, Centre Wildlife Care. Travis was awarded a four year Scholarship through the Pennsylvania State University's ROTC program and plans to pursue a degree in Nursing. Travis was also awarded the Nick Berrena Memorial Scholarship Award presented to the SCASD Senior wrestler who also participated in football and demonstrated leadership, strong work ethic, humility, joy of living, and respect for others. In addition, he received the Outstanding Athlete award presented by the United States Navy for demonstrating honor, courage, and commitment as a positive role model both on and off the athletic field. In addition, he received the Dick Morgan Memorial Football Award through the SCASD Centre Foundation.

Max Clement earned his Eagle Scout rank in September 2022. He built an 8' X 12' song bird enclosure for Centre Wilidlife Care for his Eagle Scout Project. Max served as Senior Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, and Troop Quartermaster. He will be attending Catholic University of America in Washington DC to study in a dual degree program of Civil Engineering and Architecture with a minor in cello performance. Max was awarded the Emmett C. Doer Memorial Scholarship from the National Catholic Committee on Scouting. He also received the John and Betty Baker Memorial Award, the Mincemoyer Family Orchestra Scholarship, and the Foundation for the Restoration of America Scholarship.

Miles Curling earned his Eagle Scout rank in June 2023. He designed and built two solid wood picnic tables for Corl Street Elementary's (his former school) outdoor area following a recent renovation. He will be attending Penn State University to study Mechanical Engineering.

Isaac Keim earned his Eagle Scout rank in January 2022. His Eagle Scout project was to clean-up and add informational signs to the nature trail in Mountainside Park in Lemont. He will be attending Juniata College in Huntingdon, PA and his Program of Emphasis will be Computer Science and English. Isaac is a National Merit Scholarship Finalist and was recently recognized with the Faculty Scholar Award for Outstanding Performance in English and Outstanding Achievement in Computer Programming at State College Area High School.
