

Update

Dear Friends August 8, 2016

The monthly meeting of KCPR was held Monday, August 8th. The primary reason for the meeting was to begin work on the 2017 report to the legislature, a document KCPR puts together on an annual basis. A committee was established to work on the document. We of course had a lengthy discussion regarding the recently completed primary. The general consensus was that the outcome was caused by hard work on the candidate's part. We would caution that the money spent on the General Election might increase noticeably.

As we move toward the General Election, it is likely that you will receive postcards from out of the area, from those who don't work or live here and don't raise their families here. They won't hesitate to use all matters of spins and untruth. These flashy cards are used by both sides; however, some of the incumbents in Johnson County have used these to try to convince everyone that they supported education by voting for the bill that led to the schools being funded. There were in fact only 5 no votes and three not voting in the house. Only one Senator voted against the compromised bill. Don't be fooled by the glitz and glitter! You must vet (research) the candidates of the races you have interest in and as the Wichita Eagle suggests, "Then vote with care!"

Further, we suggest that when talking to a candidate or an elected official...Be watching for the following:

- Since experience tells us that often candidates are not interested in what you have to say, be cautious when they listen. (We have at least one Johnson County legislator that is great at listening and then "voting against you".) First, you have to determine if they are listening because they know they need to, or because they are really interested in your opinion.
- 2. It is not enough to ask if they are supportive of your interest.

 Example: Are you supportive of a benefit increase for KPERS? Will you refuse to support any legislation that further "short funds" KPERS?
- 3. You must ask the next question: Will you vote for a bill that calls for an increase in KPERS benefits? Will you vote against any legislation that further "short funds" KPERS?
- 4. The place in time that we reside, members of KCPR and KARSP have witnessed multiple times when the legislator will be opposed to the leadership's position, but vote with them anyway. One recent example is the vote to "short fund" KPERS the approximate \$94million with the promise of repayment later with interest. A Senator was very opposed to any reduction, because he had been a part of voting for what was considered the "fix" when the "Cash Balance" system was introduced. But when "push came to shove," he could not bring himself to vote "against the Governor"! This is why #3 above is so important.

Regarding Voting in the General Election: We are not going to get into the Presidential race. © There are claims that if you don't vote for one candidate or the other, you are passively voting for the other. Who knows how those will playout? What we want you to do is vote for the State and Local offices even if you don't vote for President.

Important Dates

<u>Important Dates for General Election</u>

Tuesday, October 18 – Deadline to register to vote
Advanced Voting by Mail begins – Wednesday, August 19
Advance Voting in person begins – Monday, October 24, Ends Monday, November 7 at noon.
Friday, November 4 – Deadline to apply for an advance ballot to be mailed
Tuesday, November 8 – General Election

You may register to vote at your Local County Clerk, of in the large counties, the Election Office. If you are in need of a photo ID or Drivers License, they can be obtained at your Driver's License Bureau.

Remember that if you are registering to vote, you will need a proof of citizenship which would either be a birth certificate or a passport. Check with your local election office or your county clerk on this matter soon. If you are not registered to vote, do not put this action off.

"When you skip voting, it's not rebellion, its surrender!" Research makes it unclear of this quotes origin! We do know that the responsibilities placed on each citizen by the Constitution are twofold: 1. Serve on Juries and 2. Vote!
