August Blessing Box – Backpack Program



Heaven's Table offers a backpack program for needy children in Martin County's public schools, including Martin County West, Truman, Fairmont and Granada-Huntley-East Chain. The food shelf bags food for children in kindergarten through sixth grade.



Children who come from families that meet the guidelines for free and reduced school lunches also meet the guidelines for the backpack program.



The program began in 2015. When it first started it served 136 students. By the end of the first year, that number increased to 256. In the 2017-18 school year, Heaven's Table packed food for about **350 kids in Martin County** each week. The bags are distributed by the schools on Fridays before the children go home for the weekend. Teachers discreetly place the bags in the backpacks of participating students.



The bags include kid-friendly meals and snacks that are easy for kids to prepare over the weekend, including **two main courses, two breakfast items, two drinks, and four to five snack items**. The food shelf tries to include items that are as nutritionally-balanced as possible.



The average cost per bag is \$2.50. Heaven's Table estimates costs for 2018-19 will be around \$35,000.

JACK MACKEY INTERVIEW

Jack Mackey shares a long history with his family with First Congregational Church. His parents, Elizabeth (Lib) and Robert (Red) Mackey raised their children Bob, Bill, Betty, Judy, Jack, Joyce and Mary in Sunday School and Confirmation classes. Joyce and Judy are no longer living; however, Judy's daughter, Lori and her husband Jim Marushin share their children Jim Marushin and Morgan Christensen, and granddaughter Wilhelmina Diana Marushin (recently baptized) with our congregation. Jack and his wife, Mary Ellen Mackeben Mackey, were active board members and supporters until her death in 1988 following breast cancer.

Jack has continued to work behind the scenes to keep the Mackey contributions variable and of importance. As computer guru for the offices he has helped keep our pastors and administrative assistants and their technology needs handled. Serving as assistant to Jim Grotte, the brick work on the north

side of the building and the north steps was completed after the education wing was removed. As Moderator, Trustee and Finance Board member, Jack led the projects in the park, repair of the Krahmer building wall, and the sale of the parsonage.

During Mary Ellen's illness and following her death, Jack was encouraged and supported by his church family. His mother, Lib, was able to be with him as well, and he felt a special bond with Pastor Lyle Norris. "The Lord's Prayer" sung at memorial services and following Communion has special meaning for him.

As we celebrate the 150th anniversary of our church, it is right that we should remember and honor those families and individuals with generational loyalty and support. Jack and his family can claim five generations!

MACKEY RECIPES

The Mackeys were known for their wild rice and fish recipes. Here are two of their favorites from our 1989 cookbook.

WILD RICE SOUP

- 1 c, wild rice
- 2 cans cream of potato soup
- 1 medium onion
- 1 qt. milk
- $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. diced ham or 7 slices of bacon
- $\frac{3}{4}$ lb. Velveeta cheese

Cook rice in 2 c. or water. Bring to boil, then simmer for 1/2 hour. Dice and sauté onion. Fry bacon and cut into small pieces. Place in crock pot and add soup, milk, cheese. Simmer for 2 to 4 hours.



NORTHERN OR WALLEYE SPREAD

- 1 fillet of northern or walleye
- 3 stalks celery, finely chopped
- $\frac{1}{2}$ green pepper, finely chopped
- $\frac{1}{2}$ onion finely chopped

Lawrys seasoning, garlic salt, pepper to taste.

Boil fish fillet until white and flaky. Flake apart and remove "Y" bone on northern. Add remaining ingredients, adding spices to taste. (May bind with salad dressing or mayo.)


First you will be "clothed" in the White Linen Garment of the priest. At the Altar of Burnt Offering you will lay your sacrifice on it's consuming fire.

HYVEE & FAREWAY RECEIPTS

Well, we did it. As I wrote last month, I felt that the \$150,000 goal would be met sometime in July for Hy-Vee. It was met the week ending 15 July 2018 and the slips were turned into Hy-Vee on Monday the 16th. It took 42 weeks to get the goal for the 9th time.

During these four weeks, \$12,785.78 (8.52%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were turned in. This gets us started on the 10th \$150,000 goal, with \$3,282.40 or 2.19% already.

During the same four weeks, \$3,207.54 worth of Fareway slips were received or 2.13% of the total needed. Fareway is now at 92.37% of the goal, or \$138,551.27 of the \$150,000 goal. At this rate, it will still take about three months to reach the goal. The above amount has been collected over 146 weeks.

It took 4,512 slips to get the \$150,000 this time. It has taken between 4,400 to 4,800 slips each time for Hy-Vee. The amount of slips from Fareway is over 5,555 at this time.



Keep those slips coming. Even older slips can still be used as well as those where the gas was only \$0.18, yes, free gas except for the point 9 cents per gallon.

The last two weeks, gum has been in the slips. Last week wrapped at the bottom of a Hy-Vee receipt and this week in a Shopko register slip. Please be careful not to deposit gum with your receipts. Thank you.
