

I had been previously asked by my brother-n-law a few years back, to come to a closing, I saw then, the awesomeness of God's power and was touched in my heart, yet at that time, I did not move out to join or be a part of Kairos. It was only when my brother-n-law inquired of me again this year, that I felt and knew in my spirit that God was saying, now is the time, and to confirm that the timing was right, He used my wife Naresa, to say she felt that God was saying "now is the time" to launch out into the deep and serve, so here we are together. I experienced realness, men were open about their lives, nothing swept under the carpet, and my heart was convicted, which cause me to seek forgiveness and repentance. 

To my brothers and sisters in Christ, my friends and the family God promised me in the Kairos community; Hello!!! © I pray everyone is wonderful, joyous, and blessed. I pray God is showering down an overwhelming abundance of blessing upon all of you. This last Kairos weekend (#31) was such a blessing; all that were able to be there and to the graduation ceremony can attest to that!!! Jesus showed all of us how alive and real He is in all our lives over the week-end. Jesus is our risen Lord, He's not dead, and He is Alive!! He showed that He was in our presence throughout the whole week-end and that God's hand was upon all of us. God's hand was upon all of us. He orchestrated everything and everything was done by His will alone. From Dave Taylor's opening statement to Thomas Phelps closing speech and all the amazing speeches by devout men of God in between you could feel the power of God working. The men receiving the letters at the tables and some breaking down and weeping to God because of the love all of you put into those letters. I know one guy who was extremely touched and became a broken vessel before the Lord because of a sheet of paper he had received that a small child put a couple of marks on for him. God is glorious, isn't He? From our long speeches to a simple mark by a child, God can use anything and anyone to break men down and bring them before His throne of mercy. Sunday morning when Satan tried his best to keep unit 3 from the graduation ceremony and Sunday activities, all the volunteers got in a big circle and

began to pray to God. God keeps all of His promises so as they prayed, the participants from unit 3 began to walk through the door. All of God's children began to praise the Lord! We knew God had answered all of our prayers. I was praying with a group of men myself. I get goose bumps and my heart swells with happiness and joy just by talking or writing about this. I know a man from unit 3 was changed that glorious day, the Lord Jesus Christ became his savior and his redeemer. Satan knew this young man was close to coming to the Lord however no one can thwart God's plans. What God plans WILL happen. That weekend, we saw how real and alive God is and how prayer truly works! During the graduation men testified, some were broken, some rallied around their new families for strength to speak, one spoke as a minister from above, one man said "I love all of you" and raced back to his seat and that's all that really needed to be said about that weekend. God is Love!! Then came my fourth day speech. © I was nervous as the time approached and I kept praying to our Lord for Him to use me as His vessel and for Him to be glorified and for it to be Him who speaks, not me. Thank you everyone who prayed with me that day and had been praying for me up to that moment. When my name was called and I came forth and arrived at the podium, a perfect calm came over me. I knew God had to of taken the reins. I was so filled with the Holy Spirit that glorious day. I still feel like I'm on top of the mountain. When we went back to our dorms and even now, I feel different, like a constant filling of my vessel by God. Maybe this is close to what Moses felt like when he came down the mountain the second time with the stone tablets and his face was shining. I could feel Jesus in the visitation room that day during the graduation ceremony. He was in our midst. I also had to ask God for strength that afternoon, which He granted me, that I did not breakdown, like Jeremiah, the weeping prophet, during my speech so I could actually give the speech because I notice when I talk about my family, the family God promised me in Luke 18:29-30, all of you volunteers at Kairos who are my family and my heart tends to breakdown, cry, weep and open the floodgates like my brother's sing about in the choir. Only the volunteers and angels who went to the visitation room with me as the participants opened their letters in the gym, saw how I broke down into tears

because of the love I have for my family here at Kairos that God promised me. I love all of you more than words could ever express. Luke 18:29-30 is one of my favorite verses in the Bible now. Remember God keeps His promises, all of them! I have seen several men come back to the dorms expressing what an amazing weekend it was and sharing the Gospel and I know of two men who did not attend the weekend on unit 4 that have given their lives to Christ. I believe a revival is happening right here behind these walls and it fills me with Joy. People from that weekend will end up going their different ways. Some will stay in touch with each other, some won't, some will grow closer to the Lord, some will have to be chastised by the Lord a few more times, Some will remember that special weekend like it was yesterday, others will store it in the back of their minds and let it become a vague memory. I, T. N., on the other hand will remember all the volunteers, participants, and everyone there as my true family and how that weekend was the best weekend of my life! © P.S. There was also a guard that was at the graduation ceremony that was touched by everything and is even friendlier now. We never know who we are going to touch when we follow God's will for our lives and get "self" out of the way.


Notes for Women Volunteers!

Women's Prison at Eastern: Good news for women who have been wanting to do an Inside Weekend at a Women's prison, just as our men do at PCI. Initial planning is under way to develop Kairos Inside at Eastern Correctional in Maury, NC. Maury is about half way between Greenville and Goldsboro. This is a doable distance for those of us here in Northeast North Carolina who have wanted to be a part of the Inside program at a Women's prison.

There was an initial organizing meeting on Monday, May 8, in Kinston to pick an Advisory Council for Eastern Women's Correctional. Once this group is formed, submission can be made to the National Board for approval and then then the real work of putting a weekend together may start. There were about 30 people at this meeting so the nucleus for the group is there.

Kairos Outside: Volunteers have been asking about a Kairos Outside program for this area. Kairos Outside for the entire eastern part of North Carolina is in re-organization. There have been discussions about developing a program here but nothing definitive has been decided. Again, we will keep everyone up to date on the progress of those discussions. Starting any new program does not happen overnight, so whatever is decided will take time to develop.

Words from the Leader of PCI 32-Dave Taylor

Why would anyone volunteer to serve as a weekend leader?

I retired from the Navy in 2002 and have served in many leadership positions in the community since then. I have for whatever reason experienced a significant change in how I respond to the responsibilities of leadership positions, where before I relished the challenge now I feel burdened and at times overwhelmed. It has taken me a while to recognize this change and when many people encourage you to fill leadership positions because they have confidence in your abilities you become very conflicted, if I have these abilities why do I struggle so much and not enjoy it?

Well I had declined several individuals request to consider being a weekend leader telling them that when I felt a calling from the Holy Spirit to lead a weekend I would.

I have a wonderful occupation growing blackberries grapes and figs. This winter as I was pruning grapes and meditating on God's word, I was pondering the Apostle Paul. What a servant. I was considering all he endured serving God, beatings, shipwrecks, prison, very difficult travel and living conditions, all because God called him. Then the Spirit spoke to my heart, I've given you the leadership ability and sometimes you are overwhelmed? At that point I asked God to forgive me for being selfish and then went and called Jack Atwell and volunteered to be a leader.

We can all find reasons to not serve on this or any other weekend and it might be entertaining sometime to make a list of why I can't serve. It is my prayer that each and every person who reads this will prayerfully consider this: "does God want me to serve in this ministry and on this weekend "and if he does would you join me as a good and faithful servant?
